## Small Scale exhibition opens at Art 612

rt 612, a new contemporary art gallery at 612 Fleming St., presents work by a diverse group of prominent artists in Small Scale, a group exhibition curated by New York art dealer Hal Bromm. Featuring Rosemarie Castoro, John Martini, Carol Munder, Letty Nowak, Lincoln Perry, Susan Rodgers and Rick Worth, the exhibition features small scale artworks in various media including sculpture, painting, photography and works on paper reflecting the significant virtuosity of this multi-talented group.

Connecting these seven artists are several interesting threads.
