The comments from artists relating to this project are unanimously favourable. There is an artist presently involved with this project. It is presently in the design phase.

In time, this burgeoning talent will become a narrative powerhouse. The core item to bear in mind here is that learning is constant. I am always going to learn new facts, approaches and techniques both on the course and throughout my professional life.

# PROJECT ADMIN

Historically, I have worked within a busy, capable and professional project team within the financial sector. I learnt project basics through this sojourn. These key skills bleed into my approach to writing projects, in particular those that involve managing multiple team members (i.e. approaches to comic/graphic novels) in order to achieve a significant end result. One such project was a short piece about living under the shadow of schizophrenia, titled *Imaginary Tea With Demons* which, although being taken on by a publisher (Markosia) failed to see the light of day due to the team disbanding.

My basic duties whilst wearing my 'Project Hat' included: implementing financial controls and undertaking concomitant monitoring; planning basic phases for the given project; identifying Risks, Assumptions, Issues and Dependencies plus the way each will impact project realisation; general reporting along with project maintenance. This allows for a smooth transition from concept to outcome along with integrity of central ideas.
