Girl Band



For this fourth exhibition in the "New Australian Art" series. I decided to focus on a theme important to Deloitte – supporting women – and to put together a show by women depicting women. I began with a list of the most interesting women artists working in Australia today, representing a variety of backgrounds and levels of reputation, both emerging and more established. I was interested to see what would eventuate by cutting an apparently arbitrary swathe through contemporary art in order to make such a single minded selection.

Thematically, the exhibition that has resulted includes both self-portraits and women's depictions of other women. In depicting themselves, two of the artists lay all bare by presenting themselves, alternatively, as uninhibited, frenzied, and Dionysian (Justene Williams), or naked to the camera (Julie Rrap). At the other end of the spectrum, artists using their own bodies in their art may appear with their heads covered, in disquise

(Michelle Ussher). Many of the artists use the body and body language to convey their meanings and there is no shyness among the women in doing so, in works that suggest a range of realities, from latently erotic (Pat Brassington), to suggestive of violence against women (Monika Behrens and Tracey Moffatt). Works of art are no less powerful when the artists portray others in order to convey their messages, as demonstrated at the start of the show, where a sequence of figural works sets up a play between the luminous whiteness of a photograph by Petrina Hicks and a painting by Louise Hearman, and a line up of Indigenous and Asian girls by Julie Dowling, Destiny Deacon and Simryn Gill.

The exhibition title suggests a unified group, or a concerted effort or common aim when, in fact, making art can be a singularly ambitious and lonely occupation. I like to believe a bunch of

otherwise solitary female folk have been brought together here for a bit of a friendly chat or respite. On a more abiding level, certain individual characteristics are given important emphasis through the selection: self-confidence and self-knowledge; strength of purpose; honesty extending to the capacity to lay all bare; and courage extending to a complete lack of fear. Or, to continue with the "Band" metaphor, the artists in the exhibition hale from a number of generations – spanning the eras, from the Beatles, to punk rock, to Hip-hop, and on to Hardcore – and in artistic terms, their voices are very strong.


