Insight & Solution:



(Re)generate uses blackletter typefaces to celebrate typography and the similarly ancient rules that it entails. It does this by highlighting the beauty of ligatures with negative space and adhering strictly to the laws of typography.

Revive and celebrate blackletter by zooming in on the details of ligatures, allowing them to encapsulate whole pages for the viewer to truly appreciate.





To pay respects with quiet design I made an order of service style booklet and funeral service for the loss of childhood innocence.







This research driven project lead me to host a series of workshops called The Subconscious Projection Sessions. Drawing from the theory of projection, the hand is used as an extension of the mind, allowing music to guide you as you create a piece of art with your eyes closed. This process aids one to bypassing preconceptions, tapping into the subconscious for an authentic visual interpretation of the chosen song. This process ultimately ended in a large scale mural of all the participants work and an approach to design that I learnt a great deal from.

The Subconscious Projection Sessions

Brief:

Build on prior research and push to answer the questions left from my dissertation. I must find a solution that satisfies my desire for knowledge.

Insight & Solution:

Not enough studies in this field use 'art based research' so I conducted a series of workshops that tap into the subconscious mind and open the floor for interpretation and analysis.

From Brain Scans to Psychoanalysis: Using Biopsychology to Explore Trauma's Effect on Creative Outputs and Processes

Abstract:

This essay examines the relationship between traumatic experiences and artistic outputs and processes to argue that an interdisciplinary approach, such as the one provided by a biopsychological standpoint, provides unique insights into how trauma shapes art. It will look at how traumas of individual, collective, or cultural natures can alter the brain and how this is evidenced through artistic expression. The essay illustrates how trauma informs the tone, style, and motifs in creative works, using case studies that range from Picasso's *Guernica* to aboriginal Papunya Tula art. It goes on to carry the importance of trauma art into the modern day with movements and artists like Petrit Halilaj who show how trauma inspires hope and resilience among a contemporary audience. By comparing the differences as well as the reoccurring motifs across the different trauma types, the essay underlines the utility of biopsychology in decoding art and fostering healing. It is concluded with a notion for a greater abundance of art-based research as this emphasises the vitality of art's role in the processing and potential overcoming of trauma.

Men are raised with sexist ideals so this project aims to educate them through the use of performance and poetry to fight masculine stereotypes.









