

FAQs

Q: What's the best size group for in-person ceremonies?

A: I recommend no more than 10 if you don't have an assistant. It becomes difficult to properly hold space, supply materials, and get to each person for shrouding in a timely manner for more than 10. A great number to prepare for is 3-6.



Q: How much should I charge?

A: It's really up to you. Some like to offer on a donations-only basis or a sliding scale, and some charge strictly \$150 per person. Look at the market for 'similar' modalities in your area (reiki, energy work, even massage). How much are they charging per hour? You can get a gauge for how much your community is willing to pay based on that.

Keep in mind that what you are offering is very unique and potentially completely life changing! It also requires energy and dedication from you as a practitioner. Don't be afraid to charge what you feel you deserve- you can offer sliding scale tickets also to keep it accessible.

Q: What if someone has a bad experience?

A: That's okay. You can't control how people are going to react to the ceremony, though I have had overwhelmingly positive experiences and feedback throughout the years.

Your responsibilities are:

- Informing them that they will be contemplating their mortality
- Ensuring they are aware they can quit/leave at any point in time if they feel like it's too much, etc.
- Creating a non judgemental environment for them to feel as comfortable in as possible
- Providing local/general resources for extra support
- Being available for them as a practitioner for future correspondence, should they need to chat about something ceremony-related or within your professional capacity.



Q: Where can I perform the ceremony?

A: Anywhere, really! This script can be adapted to fit different time and space requirements- if you need help figuring something out, I'm always available to bounce ideas.
