
Switch-Hook Projects invites ten artists to hang work in a chiropractic office on Michigan ave; contained within American Back Center

Each wall where your eyes may expect to rest on a large abstract painting or a series of candid black-and-white architectural photographs now holds: the gentle assertion of three dimensions. Print, photograph, painting, collage, and object construct each other to circumscribe edges and frames that serve a purpose beyond display.
