The serif font arose from the desire to respond to the change in language through design and to promote the use of gender-equitable formulations. Stellar contains various gender characters such as the asterisk, which can be seamlessly varied in size and position thanks to variable font technology. Inktraps and calligraphic endings give Stellar its character. As a text font, Stellar is also easy to read in small point sizes.
