Portfolio tips

A portfolio is a folder where you collect your artistic and design work.

There are no rules regarding the format and design of the portfolio, which can also be digital.

You can present different types of work, such as:

<u>Projects</u> that you have developed in recent years, both inside and outside the school context, such as works ranging from graphic design, typography, drawings, paintings, illustrations, photographs or videos, to ceramics, textiles, sculpture, writing or others.

<u>Sketches</u>, including sketchbooks, ideias and project plans, dummies, etc.

<u>Research materials</u>, as visual or textual research, objects and other.

The Portfolio must be organised, especially so that we can see what work you have done outside and inside the school.

All work should have a short background, especially on the context in which it was developed, your idea or intention, and the work process. You can do this with notes or photos of the project's development.

Not all work needs to be finished, you can even show work that you are still working on or even errors.

You should present a reasonable range of projects, but it's more important to focus on quality than quantity.

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
