mutant Maker: Eunji Song Jiwon Song Yiyuan Zhang *Loot & Loaf* 13.04. — 04.05.25

Junson Park Yiming Wang Zihan Teng

When a crisis arrives – be it viral, climatic, or entirely speculative – something curious happens: humanity reveals its inner prepper. At the edge of reason and survival, the instinct to hoard, to mimic, to improvise takes over. Loot & Loaf, an exhibition by the collective mutant Maker (Eunji Song, Jiwon Song, Junson Park, Yiming Wang, Yiyuan Zhang, Zihan Teng), surveys the post-apocalyptic imaginary not as mere catastrophe, but as fertile ground for rethinking movement, value, sustenance, and the art of survival.


The artists approach the apocalypse not with bombast but with precision, wit, and a curious intimacy. Eunji Song's silicone sculptures, suspended from a persimmon drying rack, reimagine pest control as haute cuisine, while her accompanying sound installation conjures the relentless pursuit of a fat rat – the enemy, the prize, the protein. Jiwon Song's sculptural diptych, in porcelain clay, cloth, metal, and cardboard, reflects on the doors we open and close in moments of danger, isolation, or transformation – what must be sealed, what must be entered. Junson Park's Wandering in Waves offers an abstracted navigation of fluid, unknowable terrains – perhaps waterlogged, perhaps mental – layered on glass with the clarity of airbrushed urgency.

There is humor in the horror. Yiming Wang's Bring a Towel! is a vibrant nod to Douglas Adams and a reminder of what, in absurd worlds, becomes essential. Yiyuan Zhang's The Substance Red Bull RediX renders the energy drink can as relic – a totem of synthetic stamina, a post-capitalist survival object. And Zihan Teng's sprawling Tablecloth, stitched and glued from modest materials, acts as a kind of communal map or makeshift terrain – perhaps the dining table as last sanctuary, perhaps the battlefield of daily life.

Throughout Loot & Loaf, keywords like "Skeleton key," "Nachbildung," and "Master-level cooking skills" become entry points into an aesthetic of preparedness – where absurdity, dread, and ingenuity collide. The exhibition poses no singular apocalypse but rather evokes the plural futures imagined by game players, doomsday planners, and artists alike. If we are to loaf at the end of the world, perhaps we must first learn how – and what – to loot.
