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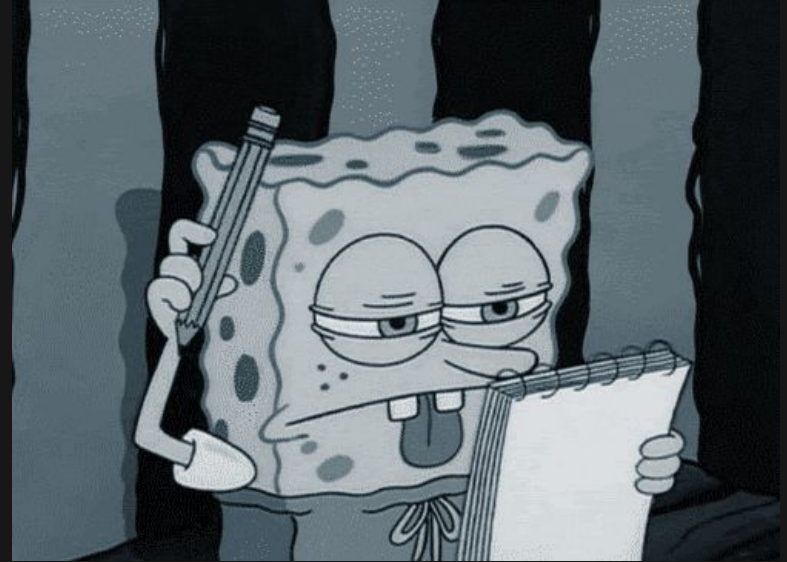
Ideations

An **in-class discussion** about Hijab and how it doesn't only pertain to the head covering is what inspired me to go into this topic. It took me by surprise when people started talking about something I assumed would be taboo due to how “extreme” the viewpoint is; it's an unpopular belief.

I'd been wandering around with topics related to the FIFA World Cup, the evil eye, and similarities between cultural fashion in regions—using other methods but this aspect about the hijab was the most interesting and *relevant* to me. I'm a covering and practicing Muslim and I grew up in that sort of family being taught certain values. One being about the hijab and everything related to it.

However, I also grew up in diverse communities, both religious and non-religious and for a long time I believed that what I knew to be hijab may come across as a more “extreme” point of view, maybe even taboo. So imagine my surprise when it was openly talked about in class, even if we were in a class where the majority are muslims. I was relieved that the knowledge was released out in the open and the feedback was way better than I'd imagined.

After the discussion, I **brainstormed** some questions I'd had about it; I was curious about its relevance in today's culture, religious beliefs and in Qatar. To inspire new ideas, I mashed the hashtags I'd come up with random images and ended up with numerous **permutations** which forced me to see my idea of the Hijab in a new way. 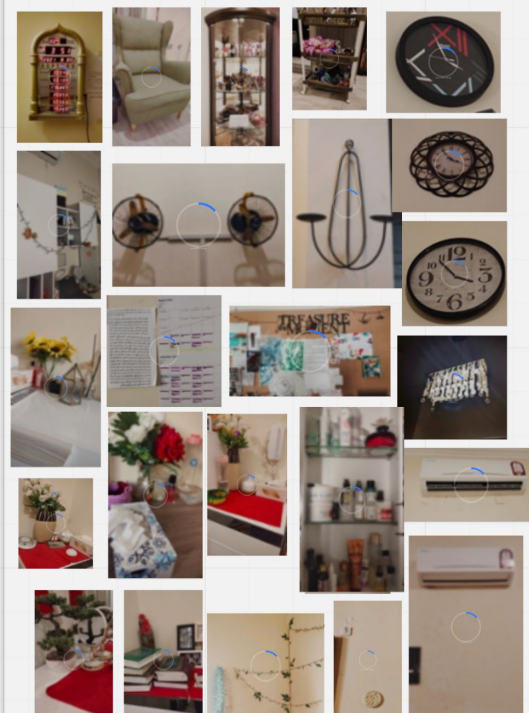

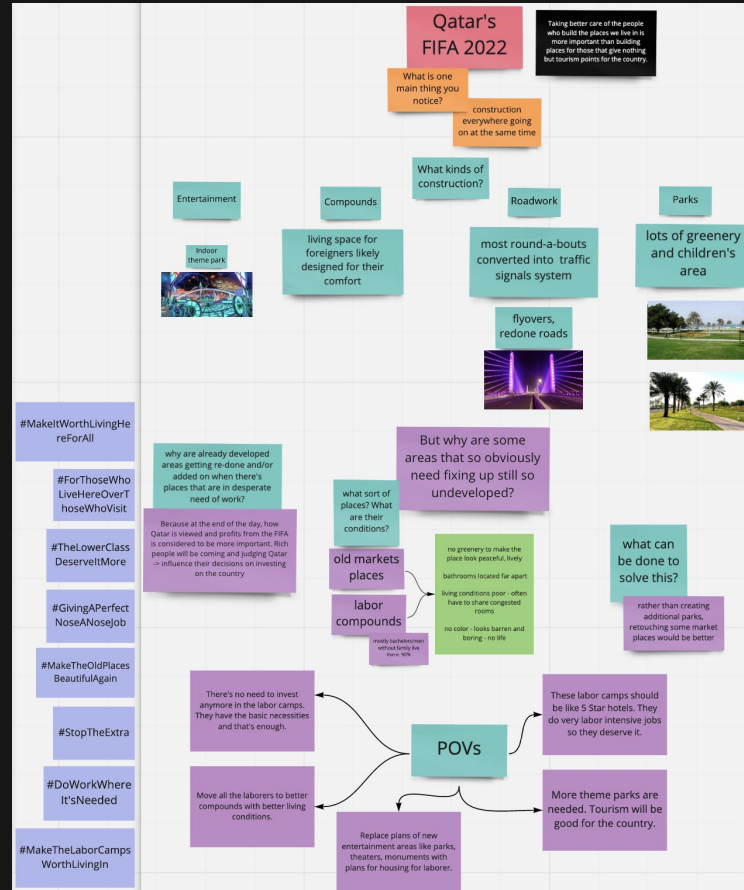

- furniture color scheme ashywood brown and white

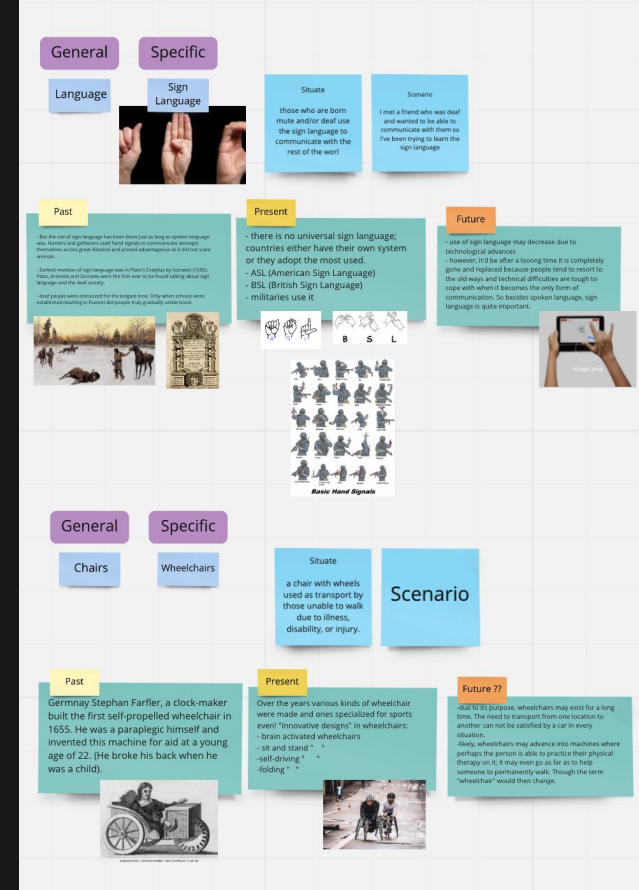

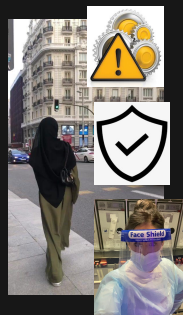
Searching up for images also exposed me to words/things similar to safety things and modesty.

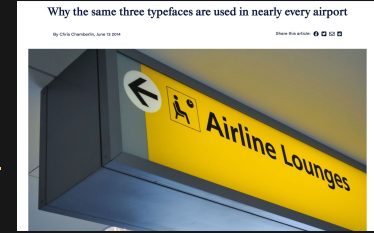
