open-source.tv is a broadcasting service for video and media art. We curate for existing displays in collaboration with artists and display hosts, with a vision to create new experiences with art in public spaces.

## Existing video displays

open-source.tv curates artistic content for video displays already installed in places such as pedestrian streets, train stations, and along highways. These screens primarily show advertisements or other information that we typically receive on our smartphones. We are interested in contextualising video and media art within both the information flow it interrupts and the diverse spaces in which it appears.

## Art in public spaces

We exhibit video and media art in public spaces to explore new ways of understanding and sharing our surroundings. Art has the power to renew and transform a place, stimulate reflection, and unlock alternative uses. Digital displays make it easier to bring art into new contexts and engage a wider audience.
