This composition examines the theme of entropy by integrating electronic textures, acoustic resonance, and the use of extended string techniques with a backdrop of experimental video. These elements coalesce to form an evolving sonic and visual landscape that supports an original poem, which delves into entropy and erosion as intrinsic processes within the natural order of the universe and ourselves.

This piece explores entropy not only as a scientific principle but as an experiential phenomenon—a meditation on the gradual breakdown of structure. It reflects how, often imperceptibly, the integrity of what once was whole disintegrates, becoming unrecognizable, only to be reconstituted in a cyclical dance of order and disorder, creation and erosion. Through this lens, entropy emerges as a continuous process of transformation and renewal.

Echos

In silent drift, the stars unwind, a dance of chaos, undefined. From order's edge we slowly fade, to dust and echoes softly frayed.

Once tight-knit threads of time untwine, lost in the weave, no shape, no line. The universe exhales a sigh, as scattered moments wave goodbye.

PERCUSSION:

The percussion table is to be mic'd into the "Percussion" track in Ableton.


Percussion Instrument List: 2 Carbonated Soda Cans, 1 Cup, 1 Bucket, Water Pitcher, 2 Bowls, Windchimes

When pouring the carbonated beverage, be sure to place the can far enough away from the cup to produce an ample amount of foam, aka a bad beer pour. The bowls don't need to be spun quickly, just enough to make them rotate. When spinning multiple bowls, ideally the bowls are far enough apart to not run into each other. The bucket is placed on the ground and the water is poured whilst standing, splashing may occur. The pouring of the soda into the bucket does not need to be audible, it is to empty the cup for the second pour. All instruments may start on the floor then be brought onto the table.

STRINGS:

Cello is to be mic'd into the "Cello" track in Ableton.

For strings, the use of heavy bow pressure is called in a few measures; being loud and not necessarily on pitch is desired. Jeté on a quarter note is quick, an eighth is quicker, while on a half note may have more space between the bow in a more relaxed manner, naturally allowing the bow to bounce on its own.

ELECTRONICS:

Movement is your friend in this piece. The more you fidget and move around the more involved the imagery will be. You don't always have to be moving, but in slow places, the limiter is turned on and movement helps increase the effectiveness of the visual.

Number in a square - Denotes a clip number. All clips are triggered by the Trigger Clip button highlighted in yellow.

A1 B1 C 0 D0 - Denotes buttons A, B, C, D for On and Off. 1 means On, 0 means Off.


1 1 0 0 - Denotes sliders \$53 \$54 \$55 \$56 respectively. 1 means 100%, 0 means 0%.

Button and Slider names in bold lettering - Improvisation how you wish until next instruction.

______ Change gradually from one sound/way of playing to another.


