




As a photographer, my work consistently leads me to explore the past, capture the present moments, and to think about preserving and archiving for future generations. It's a cycle of nostalgia, documentation, and creation. And within these trips down to memory lane, it was hard not to think about the current and future state of Panjab. As I flipped through the pages of our family photo album, they were a reflection of the stories my parents would share and felt like a romanticized version of Panjab. A time when building towards the economic and societal development of the land filled each generation with pride. As long as there are children in Panjab, there is hope. But the truth is, Panjab looks very different today. The wave of shipping kids off to foreign countries took over. Advertisements spread from the city to the villages. IELTS centres in every corner. Governments limit resources and opportunities for the youth to grow, setting them up for failure. Families going into debt with visa agents that falsely promise them a better life. No matter when you leave the motherland, the longing of home will always remain. In the near future, morning fog will haunt the empty streets. The skeletons of the abandoned houses will serve as a reminder of pinds (villages) that were once filled with life and bounty. All that will remain are the shadows of what existed.

I am an Oil painter working out of Toronto Canada. Gizem Candan (b. Istanbul, Turkey) is a visual artist and curator based in Montréal and Toronto, with a focus on painting, interdisciplinary practices and climate change. She recently graduated from OCAD University in Toronto with a MFA in Criticism and Curatorial Practice, where her thesis explored tangible and metaphysical aspects of composting and life inside compost piles while seeing it as a metaphor for transformation of mind and body. She also studied her BFAs, one in Plastic Arts and Painting and one in Graphic Design, at Yeditepe University in Istanbul. Her artistic and curatorial practice delves into the tensions and interactions between humans and their surroundings in the ecological crisis, envisioning a reimagined harmony based on her own experiences. In her paintings, she employs a variety of approaches to emphasize "figure" as both human and more-than-human, as well as the landscape-centred scenes around it. "Structure" in her paintings is visible in two distinct ways: composition and colour palette.

Candan has exhibited in Canada and Turkey at spaces such as Sivarulrasa Gallery, Almonte; TD Gallery at Toronto Reference Library, Toronto; Elgiz Museum; Pera Museum; Akbank Sanat, Istanbul; Arkas Art Center, Izmir; and Cermodern, Ankara. Candan has also curated two-person and group exhibitions at Ignite Gallery and Xpace Cultural Centre, Toronto.

My practice is primarily in drawing intimately detailed conceptual scenes. My work is often narrative, world-building from both personal experience and varied research, as a way to visualize meaning spun from life. Misbah Ahmed is a multidisciplinary visual artist and designer based in Toronto. Her practice is expressed through sentimental observations of life that are imbued with symbols and references that move across personal and historical domains. Themes in her work examine dualities, nature, shifting cultural landscapes and everyday human experiences. She interrogates such themes by exploring and imagining narratives within the Pakistan diaspora and other communities of colour existing in liminal spaces. Her practice primarily involves oil paint and ceramic sculpture, where her creative process and methodologies combine modern and traditional techniques. Her body of work has sought to maintain and continue generational practices, while simultaneously using these practices as a vehicle for reconnecting with ancestral landscapes.

In addition to her art practice, Misbah teaches within the Illustration program at OCADU. Old Growth Press, an independent Canadian publisher, represents her publication work.
