I'll be stuck



viral pandemic, which has shut
down millions of Americans
and swaths of American

century. The 200,000th beneficiary of the government's 695 health care programs had been set a grim record. "A large part of the economy just collapsed," said Ben Herzon, executive director of IHS Markit, a business data and analytics firm.

The numbers provided only the first hint of the economic cataclysm in progress. Even comparatively optimistic forecasters expected millions more lost jobs and a then foreclosures, evictions, bankruptcies. Thousands of businesses have closed in response to the pandemic, many will never reopen. Economists say the decline in domestic product this year could rival the worst years at Depression.
