While some pieces capture the thrill of the party, the focus is on the quieter aftermath—the sense of isolation and reflection that comes after the excitement ends. Featuring vibrant, 90s-inspired cartoon imagery in acrylic paint and soft pastel, Slippy Mane contrasts bright, playful visuals with subtle themes of alcohol, drug use, and the emotional ebb that follows, offering a thoughtful take on the experience of excess and self-indulgence.
