

Small Acts Of Violence, Cinematic Virtual Reality Installation, 2023, 25 mins, Colour, English spoken, Dutch subtitles, Produced by <u>ARGOS Centre for Audio Visual Arts & CON10UR</u>

Small Acts of Violence is a dreamlike cinematic 360 experience about the entanglement of love and non-consensual physical violence and self-harm in intimate/family relationships. You become a temporary member of a fictional family, placed at the center of an intimate web. You are tenderly guided through the experience by the voice of Love, who whispers in your ears, inviting you to recall your first kiss. Creating an environment to provoke embodied reactions, triggering your sense of body autonomy and need for safety, this experience challenges you to actively engage your boundaries.

Drawing from classical forms, Liparoto's ceramics become performative storytelling objects, vessels to contain potential for love without violence but also to acknowledge our own failings.








Not Proud Yet Part I-III | 'Together' @ M HKA, Antwerp , Aug 7th - September 6, 2020

These appealingly grotesque mouldy remains of tea form a fragmented story of Section 28: An act which made it illegal for local governments in the United Kingdom to 'promote homosexuality'. It was incited in 1987 and only fully abolished in 2005. This was the first anti-gay law created in the UK in 100 years, galvanised out of moral panic that effected a whole generations access to education and support. What is the embodied experience of state sanctioned homophobia? What are the new fears of moral corruption and new acts of political silencing?

Aay Liparoto withHOT BODIES -CHOIR, E2E, Transmediale, 28th Jan - 1st March 2020

In their work, Aay Liparoto acknowledges our interdependence with technology for information, work, sex, entertainment, socializing, health care, and everything in between. What does this mean for queer feminist bodies, which rely on DIY information exchange? Housed in a "void pod," this speculative choir piece is created through workshops with HOT BODIES – CHOIR, a queer, LGBTQIA+, and feminist choir based in Brussels. Cocooned in light and sound, the singers' voices invite us to reflect upon the power and politics of online spaces. The artwork is informed by Liparoto's research and Not Found On—a nonpublic wiki cocreated through workshops with, by, and for feminist queer bodies to record and exchange knowledge. The accompanying publication chronicles the collective thinking behind the project.
