New Homeland, Wonderland is a nonlinear visual poem rooted in structural film methodology. Through deliberate image manipulation, the video strips away clarity and recognizability, creating tension between modern architectural forms and raw natural textures. This contrast reflects the complex dialogue between post-industrial aesthetics and elemental nature. Moving pixels serve as metaphors for human synesthesia—each one a dynamic unit in a larger sensory system. Ethereal overlays blur dimensions, evoking a dreamlike atmosphere where reality and illusion converge. The visual field becomes a shifting space of ambiguity, inviting viewers to question perception and image. By weaving text, image, and sound, the work creates an immersive sensory experience that meditates on time, memory, and selfhood. Time collapses into a cyclical loop of introspection, suggesting that perception is fluid, layered, and continuously reshaped in the digital age.





The materials are collected through movement at varying amplitudes and speeds. These images blend with real objects and digital virtual networks. The multiple overlapping effects cause each individual image to lose its distinctiveness, creating an ambiguous screen-dominated symbolic entity. Light from the sides of black-framed screens leads cultural dissemination. Meanwhile, fine pixels create a contemporary, epidemic-like visual dissemination. Tiny pixel particles spread rapidly like a virus, affecting and altering our perception of information and visual experience, reflecting the shifts in how contemporary society handles images and information.

















