Juan-Manuel Pinzon (b. 1996, Sacramento CA) is an artist working in New Rochelle, NY. He received his BFA from Oberlin College (2018), studied at the Krenov School of Fine Woodworking (2019), and earned his MFA at Virginia Commonwealth University (2022). He has attended residencies at Vermont Studio Center and The Ellis Beauregard Foundation. His work has exhibited work across the US, most recently in his solo show dregs at the Anderson Gallery in Richmond, VA.

Erin Morris (b. 1994 Latrobe, PA) is a painter residing in Philadelphia, PA. The paintings are glimpses of significant and insignificant moments observed and impressions of the time-space between those moments.
