

The Art Matters question

Last fall, many of you were good enough to vote in support of a 4 cent per credit increase in the Art Matters fee levy. Although the increase was passed with landslide support from student voters, the board of governors rejected the results of the referendum.

Now we need you to come out and vote again in favour of this increase. Don't be alarmed! We aren't trying to scam you out of your hard-earned buck! This is a do-over, a mulligan, and not a fresh demand for fees.

Art Matters is asking (again) that our current 4 cent per credit fee levy (the lowest of any club in Concordia) be increased to 8 cents per credit (which would still be the lowest of any club!)

We encourage all of you who voted in favour of this question in October to show your support again in the upcoming March referendum, and try to make this increase finally happen! It will mean not only that Art Matters can become less reliant on donation and outside sponsorship, but that more funding can be directed to bigger and better events, exciting special projects, and most of all to students like yourself!

So please, exercise your democratic rights! An extra four cents per credit gets you an all-access pass to workshops, lectures, parties and outstanding exhibitions which make up this vibrant festival.

The VAV question

This March the VAV gallery will be asking that a fee levy be put into place to help pay for the gallery's rising operating costs. This past year the CSU generously donated money to help the VAV run but this cannot continue next year as the CSU cannot afford it. The VAV gallery is a space operated by students for students so it only makes sense that it is funded by the students. The vote this March will be your opportunity to show your support for the gallery that we all know and love.

The FASA question

Since FASA came into existence six years ago, we have not had an increase to our fee levy. FASA is growing and so is the demand for special project and club funding. In order for FASA to give more funding we need to increase our fee levy. Saying yes to this referendum question will be an investment in our future as a Fine Art Student Alliance.

THE REFERENDUM WILL TAKE PLACE DURING CSU ELECTIONS (MARCH 2005) DON'T FORGET TO VOTE!!!!



Moshekwa Langa is a black South African artist works brings together videos, photographs, works on paper and scatter-art pieces to broaden his investigations beyond the personal to the larger questions raised by globalization He is a restless scavenger who uses a wide range of materials and media - string, photography, drawing, collage, video, found objects, and painting - to record the impact of his first-hand experience of the injustices of racial segregation. His busy installation aesthetic is placed at the service of a critical wit fueled by his personal sense of displacement and alienation. Langa. Langa recently left his native country and moved to Amsterdam where he currently lives and works. Moshekwa Langa was trained at the Riiksakademie voor Beeledende Kunst in Amsterdam. His work has been presented in solo exhibitions at The Renaissance Society in Chicago, the Centre d'Art Contemporain in Geneva, and the Museum Boijmans van Beuningen in Rotterdam.

Max Dean was born in Leeds, England in 1949, and received a B.A. in art history from the University of British Columbia in 1971. Since then he has had a prolific career as a performance, video and installation artist, producing work that actively questions and explores the relationships between the artist, the spectator and the work of art. He has employed a diversity of materials from traditional drawing tools to cars, found objects, bathtubs, and television monitors as well as new technologies to explore issues pertaining to the psychological and metaphorical aspects of interactivity. He has exhibited widely - both alone and in over twenty group exhibitions - beginning with Pacific Vibrations at the Vancouver Art Gallery in 1973 - and internationally - in England, Germany, and twice at the Venice Biennale in 1999 and in 2001 for The Table: Childhood now in the Gallery's collection. He taught at the University of Ottawa (1979-88), and later at York University. From 1985-86, he was artist in residence at the National Museum of Science and Technology, Ottawa, and in 1996, he received the Jean Chalmers National Visual Arts Award.




VENUE MAPS
