

Brooklyn, famed for its musical hybrids, has rarely seen a band like Minaxi (pronounced *menaak-she*). Formed in 2018, this genre-defying quartet fuses the frenetic energy of Mumbai's outskirts with Brooklyn's alt-rock introspection, creating a refreshingly original sound that is both rooted and transcendent.

Led by Shrenik Ganatra, a multidisciplinary artist and designer originally from Mumbai, Minaxi is more than a band—it is a convergence of sounds, languages and cultures. The band integrates Hindustani and Sufi influences with the angst of psychedelia, the shimmer of shoegaze and ambient textures, and the raw, confessional ethos of Midwest emo. The result is a sonic palette that feels simultaneously intimate and cinematic, steeped in tradition yet defiantly modern.

The band's rhythm section shines with Steve Carlin's infectious backbeats and Thomas
Herndon's groove-driven basslines, anchoring their more exploratory textures. Liam Christian injects Midwest emo sensibilities, while Ganatra's Hindustani roots bring intricate melodic layers, vocal ornamentation, and depth to the sound.

Minaxi remains fiercely independent. All music is self-recorded (sans drums) and produced, and all visuals—from artwork to films—are conceptualized and executed by Ganatra, often in collaboration with the band. Minaxi's visuals extend their music into new mediums, turning songs into short films, dance pieces, and immersive experiences.

Minaxi is more than a band; it is a convergence of cultures, eras, and artistic disciplines. Their music unfolds like a dialogue—between Brooklyn and Mumbai, between tradition and experimentation, between chaos and beauty. And within that dialogue lies their brilliance.
