Since September I have been reflecting on my life through a different lens. These two artworks were realised in the period between then and now.

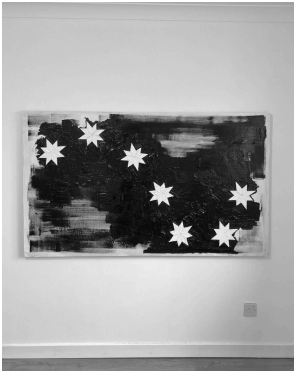


Charity (Mahogany)

This is the second in a series of kinetic sculptures. The initial power is supplied by you, the viewer, when you lift the coins into the air. When you let go gravity takes over and they accelerate across the surface of the work.

The base of the sculpture was made using reclaimed 'barley twist legs'. This form of wood turning was fashionable at the beginning of the 19th century, often used in supports for writing desks and occasional tables.
