
T M Raworth



- (RAWORTH, Tom.) His copies of the St. Joseph's Academy, Blackheath magazine, Signum Fidei, covering the years 1951, 1952, and 1953, the earliest of the three printing a lively report co-authored by Raworth on the school's new Aguarist Club and the characters involved: 'without these people our meetings would have been very tame and dull'. A photograph of the Club accompanies, and Raworth is subsequently mentioned with regard to the Aero Club of 1952. Notably there are also a couple of contributions by David Lodge, who was a few years above Raworth and makes regular appearances across the set. 8vo. Stapled or stab-stapled wrappers. 36pp., 40pp., and 36pp. respectively. Inevitable wear, the wrappers rather spotted and creased, the staples rusty, and the volume for 1952 dented, but sound enough. £300
- RAWORTH, Tom (ed.). Outburst 1, 2. and the unnumbered issue The Minicab War (both variants) (all published). London: Matrix Press, 1961-1963. 1st editions. 8vo. Issues 1 and 2 stapled wrappers, The Minicab War folded sheets loosely held in wrappers (though some copies were stapled). Unpaginated (16pp.-52pp.). A rare complete set of Outburst, the second issue being notably hard to find, with The Minicab War present in both white and blue wrappers. That publication, ostensibly by 'de la rue', 'sykes', and 'o'moore', is in fact
- a collaboration between Raworth, Anselm Hollo, and Gregory Corso. Probably dating from late 1961, it 'was done with the hope that it might give a benevolent lift to the satirists of the Establishment', and was occasioned (in Raworth's words) by 'a war that was then going on between minicabs (gypsy cabs) and the official black London taxis'. Other contributors to the magazine include Charles Olson, Allen Ginsberg, Edward Dorn, Piero Heliczer, Larry Eigner, LeRoi Jones, Denise Levertov, Fielding Dawson, Gary Snyder, Philip Whalen, Robert Creeley, Gael Turnbull, Paul Blackburn, David Meltzer, Douglas Woolf, Carol Bergé, David Ball, Chao Tze-Chiang (translations of Tu Fu), Christopher Logue, Michael Horovitz, Pete Brown, ruth weiss, Pentti Saarikoski, Alan Sillitoe, and Barry Hall. Some basic annotations in pen to issue 1 (mainly just ticks) and a small splodge to the cover, but a Very Good collection overall, that issue outwardly somewhat rubbed and marked/toned. both sets of staples slightly rusty, issue 2 and The Minicab War spotted in (generally peripheral) places. A flyer for the first issue is also included. £575

- 6. (RAWORTH, Tom.) HELICZER, Piero. & i dreamt i shot arrows in my amazon bra. Brighton: The Dead Language and London: Matrix Press, nd.

 Narrow 4to. Sheets folded into 20pp., loosely held in wrappers. Apparently a proof copy of the 2nd edition (an earlier edition having been dittoed by Anselm Hollo), from Raworth's files, all present and correct (including the lavender-coloured sheet) save for the cover image (which also appears in Outburst 2) and the stapling. Very Good. £400
- (RAWORTH, Tom.) HOUÉDARD, Dom Sylvester. An original typestract for Raworth entitled tiny poem for tmr by dsh 171063. Single white sheet (12.7 x 20.3cm) folded so that two flaps open to reveal the work, the uppermost





- flap bearing the title. Small patch of discolouration to the front (not affecting the type), otherwise Fine. £350
- 8. RAWORTH, Tom (poem) and HALL, Barry (rose). Continuation. London: Goliard Press, 1966. 1st edition. One of 15 numbered copies printed on handmade Japanese paper, signed by the author and the artist (of 165). Single silvery grey sheet (40.1 x 23.4cm) printed in black, green, and yellow-red on one side only. Mild and partial horizontal crease, a gentle bump towards the head edge, but Near Fine given its fragility. £225
- 9. RAWORTH, Tom (poem) and HALL, Barry (rose). Continuation. London: Goliard Press, 1966. 1st edition. One of 25 numbered copies signed by the author and the artist (of 165). Single white sheet (40.2 x 23.3cm) printed in black, green, and yellow-red on one side only. Fine. £150
- 10. RAWORTH, Tom. The Relation Ship. London: Goliard Press, 1966. 1st edition. One of 400 copies (of 450, plus 6 specially bound). Small 4to. Quarter yellow cloth. Unpaginated (60pp.). Containing three illustrations, offset printed, then blind-embossed and hand-coloured by the artist, Barry Hall. Spotting to the edges and prelims, the boards a little marked (probably in production), the printed glassine dust jacket somewhat nicked and chipped as usual, its head edge quite ragged, but Very Good all things considered. This copy has the ownership inscription of Andrew Crozier. £50

 Unpaginated (60pp.). Good only, slightly musty and toned, the spine a touch rolled, the jacket tired and with loss to the (plain) front flap, but more appealingly this copy has been signed by the author in 2003.
- 13. RAWORTH, Tom. The Relation Ship. London: Goliard Press, 1966, 1st edition. One of 400 copies (of 450, plus 6 specially bound). Small 4to. Quarter yellow cloth. Unpaginated (60pp.). Very Good Plus. This copy has been signed by the author and inscribed to Ray (DiPalma), and is held in a dust jacket printed with a blue/grey and black image and purple text. Prior to the recent discovery of the two copies below, the only other example of this jacket known to this cataloguer is in the collection of one of Raworth's literary executors, Miles Champion, who has suggested that the experiment of this different cover was abandoned perhaps partly due to the illegibility of the text. It is worth adding that the spine is titled by hand (faded in this case) and that the panels other than the front are

- unprinted, which gives it the look of a proof (although, admittedly, the finished glassine jacket on regular copies is only printed on the front), yet also that the inscription is from 1971, some time after the abandonment. (There were in fact 6 proof copies designated as such in Raworth's hand, with the usual binding, while it is not clear whether or not the 6 specially bound copies were ever produced.) Somewhat edgeworn, chipped towards the spine head, the lower panel with offsetting from the paper-covered boards, but striking nonetheless. £300

Small 4to. Quarter yellow cloth. Unpaginated (60pp.). Some spotting to the edges and mild offsetting to the endpapers, otherwise Fine, the (very fragile) special wrapper and its unprinted glassine jacket slightly crumpled at the head edge, the former a little spotted there and the latter chipped at the spine head, but particularly crisp for the most part, held in the unused dust jacket, a little marked in places and with a trivial nick, but a beautiful and intriguing copy. £650
- 15. RAWORTH, Tom. The Relation Ship. London: Goliard Press, 1966. 1st edition. One of 400 copies (of 450, plus 6 specially bound). Small 4to. Quarter yellow cloth. Unpaginated (60pp.). This example with both the unused jacket and the usual printed glassine. One illustration



present twice (not included in the above collation, and not at the expense of another); that aside, spotted to the edges (primarily the head edge), the glassine somewhat ragged at the head, a little marked around the spine, and somewhat spotted/splashed to the lower panel, the unused jacket unobtrusively discoloured at the base of the spine (perhaps from water damage) and with a couple of pocks to the upper flap fold, though generally crisp. Very Good. £225

A prospectus from Goliard Press for publication June 1966, for the most part looking towards *The Relation Ship*, the details of which differ slightly from those of the finished edition. Single light grey/green sheet folded once into 4pp., 8vo, printed in gold and yellow on the upper panel, otherwise in black. The illustration is that used on both the cover of *Outburst 2* and Raworth's exceedingly rare broadside *Weapon-Man*. Very Good, the spine creased and a little spotted. £30
- 17. (RAWORTH, Tom.) Turret Poets Read. London: Turret Books, 1967. 1st edition. Single sheet printed on both sides, folded twice into narrow 4to. Promotion for an event at the ICA, printing poems by Jeff Nuttall, Christopher Logue, Edward Lucie-Smith, George MacBeth, and Kevin Crossley-Holland, plus photographs from Juicy Movie, a film by Raworth and Barry Hall. The leaflet was designed and printed by the Goliard Press. Good or better, somewhat rubbed and toned, this copy designated as 'complimentary'. £15

The spoof issue, being a parallel pp.328-334 in a lookalike format, sent to everyone on the worksheet's mailing list. 'Contributors' include J. H. Prynne, Barry MacSweeney, John James, Peter Riley, John Temple, Jim Burns, Tim Longville, Peter Armstrong, Gill Vickers, Edward Lucie-Smith, Erwin Klopstock, Kipling, and Chaucer. Moderate staple rust and a horizontal fold, but Very Good Plus. £200
- 19. [RAWORTH, Tom (ed.)]. "before your very eyes!". London: Goliard Press, 1967. 1st edition. 4to. Stapled wrappers. Unpaginated (12pp.). Including Charles Olson, Aram Saroyan, Ron Padgett, Anselm Hollo, Jack Hirschman, James Koller, and Raworth, plus pictures by William Jahrmarkt. Slightly creased around the spine, and with a few splashes to the upper wrapper/fore edge (made less perceptible by the cover's colour). Very Good overall. £50
- 20. RAWORTH, Tom. The Big Green Day. London: Trigram Press, 1968. 1st edition. One of 100 copies (of an unspecified total), in special wrappers, numbered and signed by the author and the artist. Small 4to. Orange/brown cloth. 50pp. Cover and drawings by Jim Dine. Boards slightly splayed (as often seen), the cloth with a few small bumps and areas of fading, but Very Good overall in the dust jacket, echoing the bumps, the additional translucent jacket somewhat

- marked and rather puckered. £100

Orange/brown cloth. 50pp. Slight spotting to the edges and offsetting to the endpapers, but Very Good Plus in Near Fine, particularly crisp dust jacket, just lightly bumped/creased to the spine head and one flap edge. This copy, although not one of the special copies, has been signed by Raworth and Jim Dine.

Raworth, who appeared in one of the films advertised, *The Stone Age*, contributes a 16-line text to the flyer, which is Very Good, slightly

- creased and spotted, and is offered together with a typed postcard from Raworth (in London) to Heliczer (in Paris), dated 24 July 1961. Among other things Raworth discusses the possibility of acquiring a new printing press: 'if all goes well you wd be wellcome to use during day for any printing you cd get dick my printer is snowed under with work & wd no doubt be pleased to farm some out to you will need it in nights for doing outbursts etc.'. The two produced the 2nd edition of Heliczer's & i dreamt i shot arrows in my amazon bra soon afterwards. Very Good with a mild crease. £150

Alastair Johnston explains how, after Hearst's San Francisco Chronicle published artist's renderings of how she might have changed her appearance with wigs and glasses, Hermes Free Press used the press photos to produce this 'cleverly structured

- miniature book with pages that fold over one another to show the permutations of Hearst's changing identity. Raworth recalls that he had the idea in one of those What if? conversations with Michael after a liquid lunch, and the team sprang into action, turning the book out overnight' (Zephyrus Image: A Bibliography, p.99). Somewhat worn from use, with a stain mildly affecting a corner of the rear (text) panel though otherwise only really visible on a couple of unprinted areas, but Very Good all things considered, intact, working well, and extremely rare, this copy also with Johnston's pencilled ownership inscription. £350



The issues of that series are held in their original envelopes (also colourfully stamped), sometimes with James's address (in Raworth's hand or on a printed label), a few with signs of having been posted; issues I-L and M-P are grouped together.

Curiously, disparities can be detected between copies of some issues, in which lettering by Raworth or even found images differ. This is probably because *Infolio* was photocopied in two places (a copy shop and Val Raworth's work), often as a result of illness and time spent as an inpatient at Addenbrooke's. Nevertheless, it is surprising to see variants in such a rapid production.

By the time of the 'half-way report' for the first series (in issue 20) there were ten subscribers (across four countries), and copies were selling through Compendium in London and SPD in Berkeley, CA. By issue 40 there were twenty-six

subscribers (from eight countries) and the initial rule of 'no free copies' had been relaxed slightly. In issue 92, which in theory should have ended the second series (after fifty-two weekly issues), a 'few sets' of the first series are advertised, and it is clear that a subscription would buy a series from start to finish regardless of when it was purchased, allowing readers to catch up. (Issues 93-100 were free to subscribers.) So the number of copies in circulation was able to increase for a while, and (according to John James's card) there were at least seventy-one subscribers to the third series, but Infolio was fast-paced and widely dispersed, and this is the most complete collection that this cataloguer has encountered. It is in Fine condition, and is held in the floral box used by James. £3250
