breaking in through my window

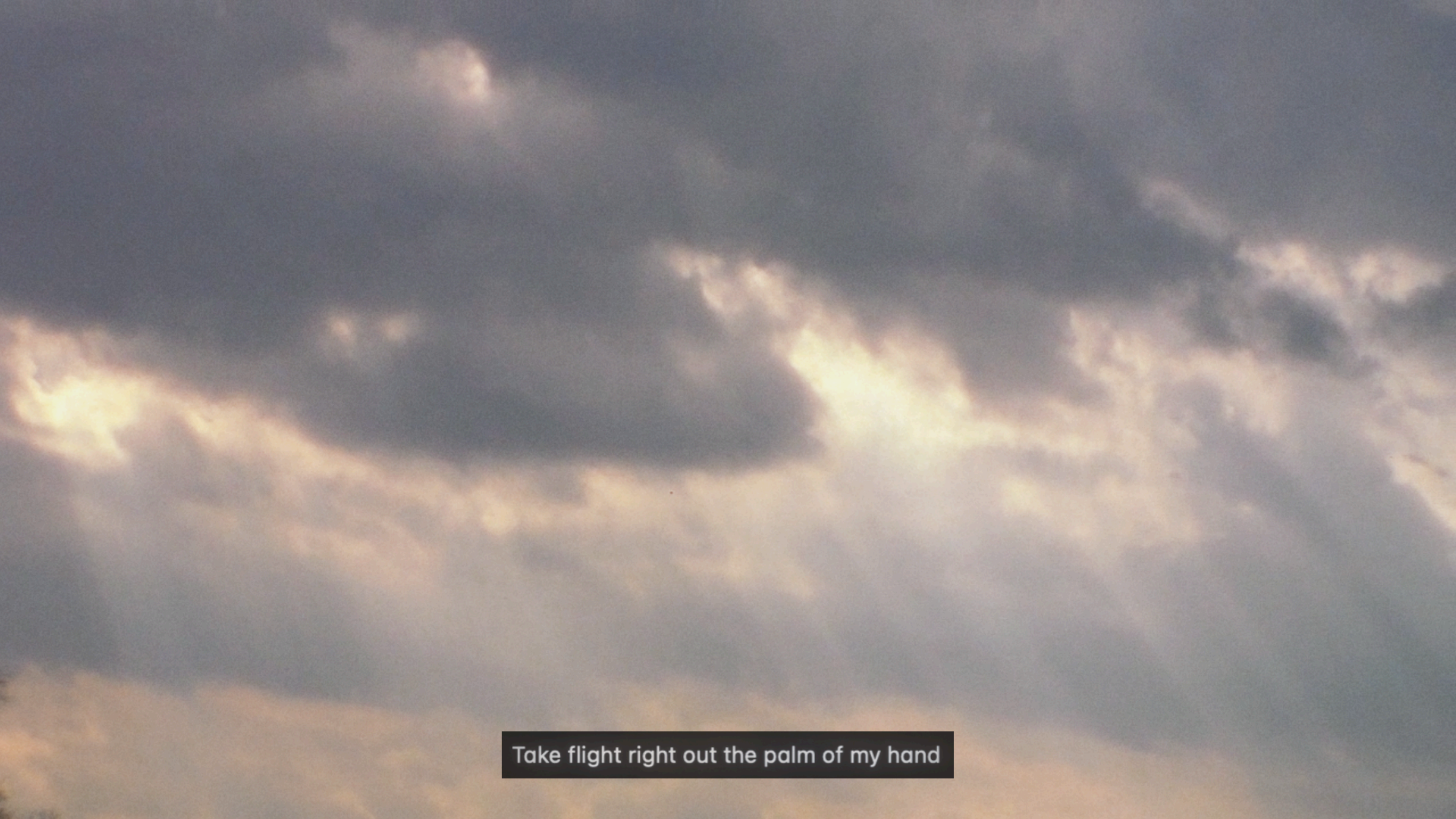

I saw you aim for the end


but I forget in the morning|

Cause even when you're face down


You still reach for your gun

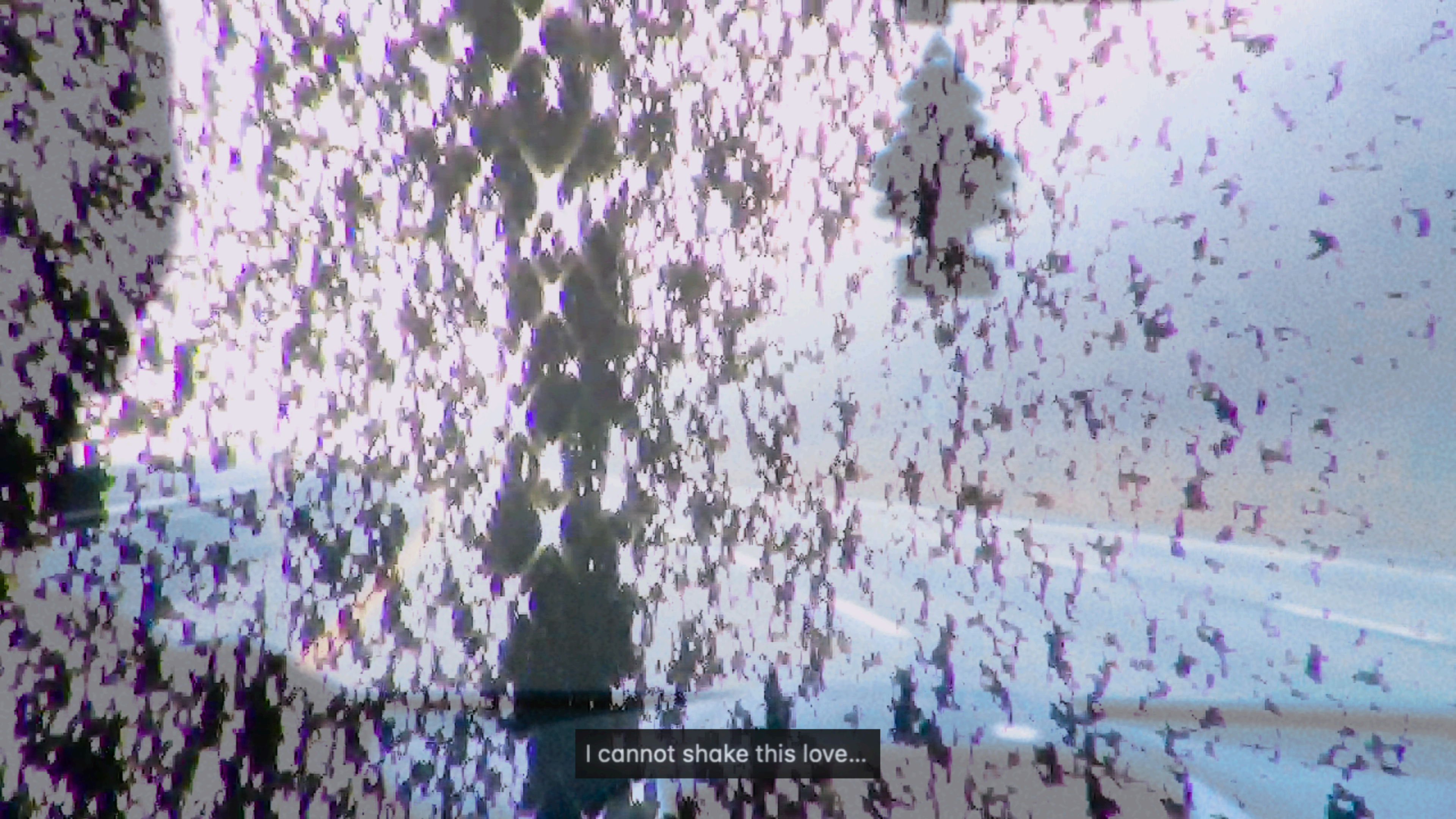


I don't know where we'd start.

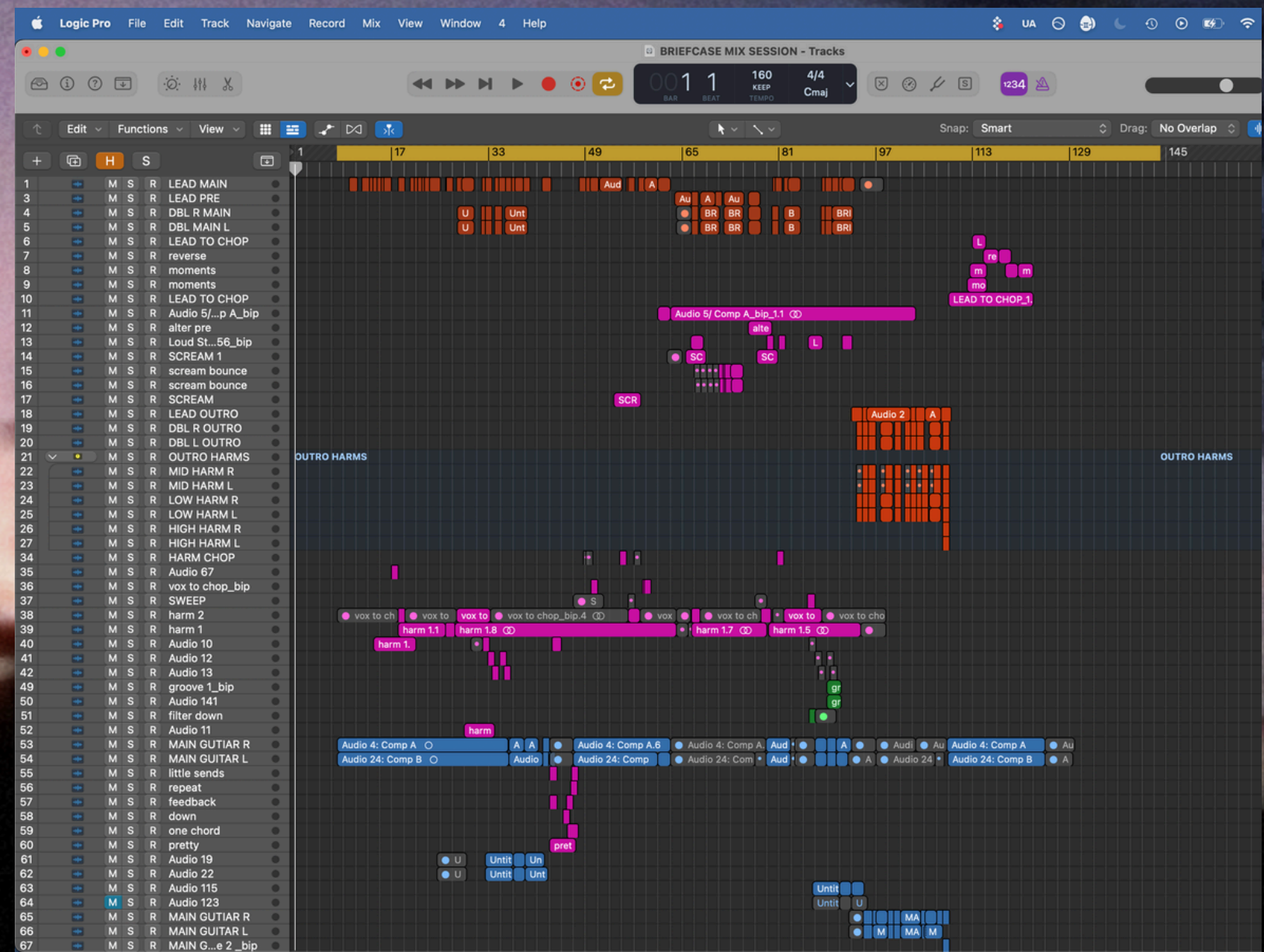
Guilt Around Estrangement Isn't Talked About Enough

You are grieving the loss of possibility. Death means reconciliation will never happen. What you are feeling is perfectly normal. So is second guessing yourself.

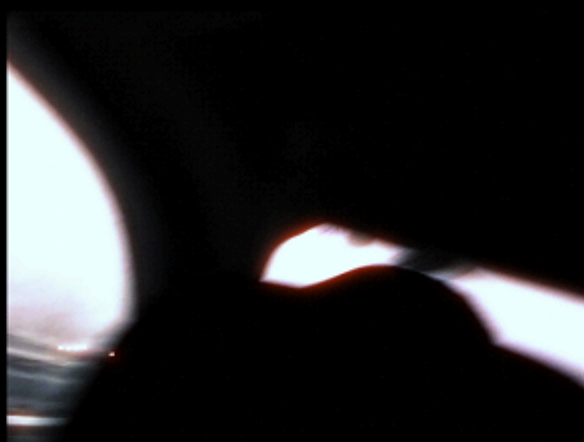

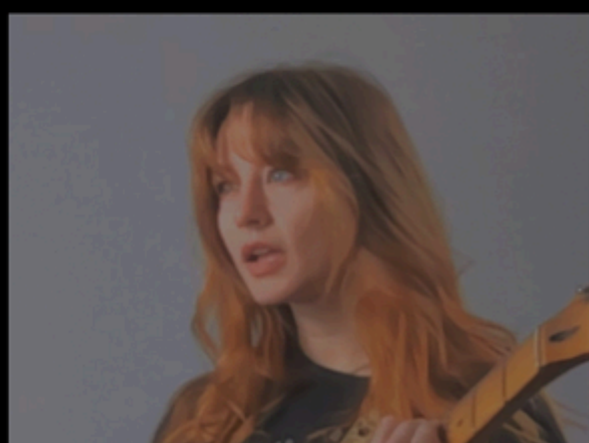
