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
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



Art Matters is a festival that creates an atmosphere of celebration in artistic expression, exploration and collaboration.


Art Matters is open to all art forms in any language.

History



In The Year 2000... five Concordia Fine Arts students (Julie Fowler, Ruthie Sumiko Tabata, Yael Wand, Michael Golden and Declan O'Drischoll) saw the need for students to exhibit their work to their peers and the public. The result was Art Matters: two weeks of student art in professional venues and galleries throughout Montreal. The festival proudly exhibits all art produced by Concordia students: animation, dance, design, film, music, spoken word, theatre, video and visual art.

Now in it's ninth year, Art Matters has become a renowned festival that showcases the incredible emerging talent of Concordia students. The biggest student run art festival in Canada, past venues have included the World Beat Music Centre, Musée D'Art Contemporain, Art Mûr, The SAT, The Corona Theatre, Art en Majuscule, The Darling Foundry and others. In 2005 the festival received Best Art Exhibit in the Montreal Mirror's Annual "Best of Montreal" readers poll and has consistently ranked in the top 5 since then.



Motion Graphics

Combining motion-graphics and video footage, this piece expresses itself through the desire to break away from the monotony of our everyday lives as they inevitably settle into routine.

Sculptural Installation

A rolling stone gathers no moss" This proverb describes our installation, which will be a reflection about contemporary society and how life is so rushed nowadays.

Christophe Lennox Sacrifice

Painting

Centering on historical and religious narratives, this diptych seeks to explore issues of religion, race, condition, and sacrifice in both a colonial and contemporary context.

Narratives is an open concept meant to encourage experimentation and interpretation. Works range from the challenging of conventional narrative forms to the exploration of the narrative process. The end result is an unconventional gallery experience that places artists and designers in the same space, often blurring the lines between the two entities.

Sound Installation

Drawing influences from Electro Acoustics, Hip-Hop and Free-Jazz, Jackson Darby appropriates obscure vinyl samples combined with electronic sounds creating unique narratives within composed studio works.

Sculpture and Installation

The project is an installation that represents a dream. The dream is a visual journey of the human mind and body, explored and deconstructed.

Sophia Burke Five Years of Gingham

Illustrations and Sound

An anthropological view of the material influence on our lives. Illustration and audio narrate the artist's grandmother's years of living surrounded by the same gingham fabric.

The premise is simple: "Rent" an apartment that is "under-construction" and not fit for habitation, then invite people to "construct" the interior of the space with found objects. Participants are invited to bring objects they can use as material (be it a crayon or a fridge). Anything in the space is fair game to re-arrange. The space will be available for unfettered public access for the length of the project. Although, the construction of the interior is emphasized, participants are encouraged to the use space in anyway they see fit: as a gallery, studio or performance space.
