

As the pandemic stretched into its second year, we put our best effort into serving our community, spending January to June engaging participants on Zoom and distributing free art kits via our Art City Curbside Takeout project. We poured our heart and soul into it, with all staff members contributing to instruction design, kit packing, and order taking. We started with a menu of twenty kit options in an awesome range of art media, then quest artists from the community stepped up and designed kits based on their practices. When winter turned into spring, we launched a refreshed and improved menu. By June, we had distributed more than 10,000 Curbside kits to folks down the street and all the way up to some of our most remote Northern communities. July brought our triumphant return to in-person programming, offered outdoors until the fall, when we moved back inside to busily create our youth-led Halloween event, the Doomsday Monster Carnival Course. November and December felt, for the first time in a long time, like a return to traditional, after school, process-based art programming.

We had made it through a challenging year, the format of our work shifting radically but the spirit of our work intact and uninterrupted (well, until the very last days of December).

Art City thanks our friends in the restaurant business for inspiring Curbside Takeout, Sotirios Kotoulas and Akman Management for hosting us at Sherbrook Flats, Suzanne Mozdzen and Jordan's Principal for extending the reach of our work, Bruce Spielman and Kathy Koop for providing water and power for our outdoor programming, and everyone who worked to keep us safe and healthy in 2021.

The purpose of Art City's Community Programs is to bring that "Art City magic" to locations beyond our home base in West Broadway. This means access to creative, high-quality experiences no matter your age, background or skill level. In 2021, we were invited to deliver over 6,200 art experiences.

In the start of that year, when COVID spread was high and vaccination was still pending, our focus was to provide both take-home art kits to our long-time community partner groups and virtual workshops. We delivered thousands of specially designed art kits to people in the dead of winter. We were also able to teach virtual workshops on: positive affirmation for teens, drawing for seniors, web-based animation, art for newcomer families, youth with FASD, and more. I applaud our outreach facilitators for I being so flexible and learning new technology in order to get art to so many people during such an intense phase of the pandemic.

In the second half of 2021, we returned to in-person art, happening primarily outdoors. Our days were filled with community murals, summer camps, a pow wow and community barbeques. COVID measures were still strict and took a lot of effort for everyone, but our hearts were filled up again by seeing participants in real life. In a year where everyone had very little consistency and often less creative stimulation than normal, it's good to know that Art City provided art and ideas to so many folks every week, no matter what.
