

The New Nation of Great Lakes

An Introduction

The New Nation of Great Lakes (NNOGL) is built on three main values: Environment, Advancement, and Eachother. History

The Nations Creation



and established more health in its population than had been seen in decades. People being healthy meant for a stronger population that could support itself and grow even stronger.




History

Borders are also created by natural geography like rivers and dynamic terrain.

It was important to those who started the nation that the country's borders absorbed any major cities near the lakes. Because of the safety and abundance of resources, the NNOGL has become the most populated country in the world, the most populous city being Chicago. Each city has developed their own unique attractions and cultures despite being relatively



Symbols

Flag

Our flag highlights the country's affinity for elegance and simplicity. The iconic blue and green circle represent the lakes and the land respectively. But the band around the blue circle also represents our dedication to protection of these lakes and our natural resources. It was important to include the navy blue to honor the many cities in the country that had navy as a part of their city flags.



Seal

The seal takes inspiration from previous older American seals, many of which also depict a landscape. This approach is a more graphic take on that tradition. There is wavy land to show the dynamic and beautiful landscapes the geography that the NNOGL has to offer. The star with its 5 points represents the five great lakes, and the birds exist to add some visual harmony and to complete the nature scene. Finally the tree is depicted as just a triangle. Many failed and rejected previous attempts at a seal included a more detailed tree, but the shape did not work with the more simplistic approach that the rest of the scene had. Eventually a triangle was selected due to its ability to be simple, but still clearly communicate a tree. The seal can be found on various government documents and currency.





Lakes Silhouette

The outline of the great lakes is a beautiful silhouette that is present throughout different visuals relating to the NNOGL. The complex pattern makes it good for security like on government documents, currency, and passports. Its iconic silhouette also makes it suited for things like merchandise and branding.



Rejected Flags

With the creation of the NNOGL being relatively recent in history, many rejected flag designs are archived. There were many different directions to take the flag; it was challenging for designers to find a way to summarize our modern and complex nation with just one symbol. You can see the usage of familiar elements like circles and green and blue. But you can also see new ideas like stripes and stars.

Currency

Our currency consists of one, five, twenty, and one hundred dollar amounts. Banking is done electronically for the most part, but there are always some benefits to having the option of physical money as well. The early days of our country saw a large amount of cash transactions due to the slowdown of computer manufacturing in foreign countries. These institutions have been established but we still keep cash around.

The designs for each bill showcases our new focus on nature rather than celebrating ourselves. Our one dollar bill features a Yellow perch, which is a very common fish in our lakes. The five dollar bill showcases a wolf. The Twenty dollar bill has a bear, also found in our wilderness. Finally our one hundred dollar bill has the rare Golden-Winged Warbler.

The other side of the bills have non descript nature landscapes. These landscapes are based on photos that were taken across the different lakes in the NNOGL

These designs have hard to replicate and complex patterns on them. Yet from far away they can be spotted. With a diverse color palette amounts can be easily deciphered by citizens who struggle with sight, a common problem in the post global warming world.





Passport






