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Artist Statement:

Final Site considers architecture's relationship with trauma and links the late Paul Virilio's assertion that technology and in particular the speed and accelerative nature of the image has its own inherent violence, to Roger Luckhurst's thesis on the intersections between photography and trauma. Manley's work uses the built environment as a conduit to explore these ideas trough a visual practice grounded in the psychological musings of J.G. Ballard.

Bio:

David Manley studied at the College of Fine Arts (COFA) UNSW, majoring in Photo-media and graduating with 1st Class Honours and the Dean's Award for Academic Excellence. He holds a PhD in Fine Arts and a Masters of Fine Arts by Research. He has been a finalist in the 2011, 2013 and 2015 Bowness Photography Prize and the 2014 Josephine Ulrick and Win Schubert Photography Award. In 2012 he was a winner of the Head On Photographic Portrait Prize. Manley was one of sixteen Australian artists selected for the publication Hijacked III Contemporary Photography from Australia and the UK.
