 Fe Lugo is a Bronx-born, genderqueer, mixed-media artist, writer, and educator whose practice interrogates identity, resilience, and power through both material and conceptual approaches. Lugo bridges the tactile and theoretical, creating works that reflect their lived experience as a gender-nonconforming individual navigating intersecting systems of race, class, and representation.

Their work grapples with themes of gender fluidity, commodification of identity, and the historical imprints of colonialism and globalization, using sculptural practices to transform abstract ideas into tangible encounters. Writing is integral to their process, providing reflective layers and narrative depth that challenge and engage audiences.
