Learning Objectives	 Build knowledge of storyline routines, science content, and pedagogy called for with the HQIM, OpenSciEd materials, experiencing it as learners and educators. Engage in reflective discussions focused on the pedagogical shifts that are required to implement OpenSciEd with all students. Review planning and preparation needed to engage students in OpenSciEd activities- anchoring phenomenon routine, investigations, modeling, equitable discourse, and sensemaking. Examine the formative and summative assessments that are included in the OpenSciEd storyline and develop an assessment plan that fits the school's grading system. Enact pilot unit with students, engaging them in the unit with integrity. Reflect on student experience with OpenSciEd materials and evaluate outcomes to consider adoption. Support a weekly community of practice to support teachers during the pilot.
