RESUME

Profile

Adam Vackar is an artist and researcher based in Prague, Czech Republic. His conceptually driven work spans the fields of visual art, biology, ecological thought, and power structures. His recent artistic research explores biological processes and human interactions with migrant (invasive) plants, examining how knowledge production and power dynamics shape political, social, racial, and spiritual relationships. Since 2021, he has focused on research around the Giant Hogweed, investigating both non-human and human perspectives. Vačkář approaches the plant not only as a botanical phenomenon but as a complex cultural and historical metaphor. Originally from the Caucasus and introduced as an ornamental plant by botanists and nobles to Europe in the 19th century, this plant has come to symbolize deeper ecological disruptions linked to human intervention. His research traces the spread of Hogweed in post-World War II Czechoslovakia, focusing on how the mass displacement of populations following the expulsion of Sudeten Germans facilitated the plant's colonization of abandoned landscapes. This research positions the Hogweed as a "biological ghost" of historical trauma, a living trace of war-torn, neglected regions left in ruin. Engaging with botanists, biologists, media psychologists, engineers in new technology, eco-feminists, as well as spiritual thinkers and healers focused on plants in the UK, US and Czechia, Adam Vackar creates a complex analysis of humanity's approach to nature, as well as envisioning possible scenarios and new paths of thinking for the ecological challenges of the 21st century. Vackar is currently working on a book showcasing his research on the subject, set to be published in 2025 by the Dutch publisher Onomatopee, along with a documentary film, for which he's been gathering material over the past three years.

His work has been presented at institutions such as Centre Pompidou, Art Basel, S.M.A.K., Palais de Tokyo, Cologne Kunstverein, Museum Morsbroich, National Gallery in Prague, City Gallery Prague, FRAC Occitanie Montpellier, FRAC Champagne-Ardenne, FRAC Franche-Comté, among others. His work has been reviewed in Artforum, Flash Art, Tique, Mousse Magazine, Art Net. His works are in numerous institutional and private collections.

Professional Positions and Community Service

Since 2021 Adam Vackar co-runs the interdisciplinary platform <u>Transparent Eyeball</u> with evolutionary biologist Dr. Jindrich Brejcha, Assistant Professor, Department of Philosophy and History of Science, Faculty of Science at Charles University. <u>Transparent Eyeball</u>, being a collaborative practice at the intersection of visual art and biology, with overlaps in botany, anthropology, landscape architecture, geology, and philosophy, focuses on organizing exhibitions, conferences, lectures and performances. The platform aims to explore new axes of knowledge based on the understanding of the biological perspective of life and existence for both non-human species and humans. It aims to raise both expert and wide audience awareness about natural processes and visual art.

Since 2016 Adam Vackar co-runs the platform <u>Hope Recycling Station</u> in collaboration with renown Berlinbased art historian Noemi Smolik, organizing lectures with distinguishes international artists, curators, museum directors, thinkers, scientists, philosophers, and writers. In its recent projects, the platform focuses on decolonial reflections in Eastern and Central Europe and Central Asia. Vackar is also a co-curator of the 2024 edition of the renowned <u>Fotograf Festival</u> in Prague, presented across four major venues and showcasing works by eighteen international artists.

Vackar regularly gives lectures and seminars on his work and research at his home institution - the Faculty of Fine Arts, Brno University of Technology - as well as at other institutions such as the Center for Contemporary Art in Prague, the Fotograf Festival, previously also at Jeu de Paume in Paris and Palais de Tokyo. He also conducts regular courses with Czech high school students.

Between 2021 and 22 Adam Vackar held the position of Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Education, Charles University, where he taught new approaches and methods of art education.
