Painting ~ Elisabeth Hazell *Kaffine

Patterns and symmetry constantly occur throughout nature, but with the organic variations that arise from natural chaos. These abstract layered watercolors explore the world with an acknowledgment of its inherent beauty.

Painting ~ Timothy Kasper ~ Everyday People in the Subway *Kaffine Depicting people and their facial expressions and gestures, these paintings find the personal in the complete strangers we pass on the metro each day.

Carnival has long captured the imagination of the human psyche. the mystery of masquerade allows one to enter and embrace the symbolic world of fantasy, but even masked, one often conveys a sense of vulnerability and sensitivity. In these works the grotesqueness of a body is glorified through flesh as the body becomes a landscape where distinct body parts combine to create a whole.

Focuses upon the idea and relationship of the player and the stage, with a concentration on symbols that best represent the daily stuggle htat one may face in revealing truth.

Photography ~Kari Seckins and Jennifer Vivian ~ Instinctual Animals *H A photographic sequence depicting the relationships and interactions between humans and animals.

Visual art/student-run workshop/book art ~ Elizabeth Sweeney and Sarah Mangle/ NDG YMCA children's class in Bookbinding, papermaking and collage

Various student works (aged 6-12)

This small collection of work is the result of a Concordia student and alumni taught class in creative bookmaking. Showing various forms of bookmaking the children, aged 6-12, young students also play with various forms of collage, and have made paper from recycled materials. This class gives an opportunity to expose children to new methods of art making that they may otherwise not experience in the school system.

In manipulating images of real people, a fictional narrative is assigned to every-day events and interaction. Through layering, drawing and photography the banal reaches iconic status.

Textiles ~ Emily Birnbau ~ Textiles *H - Java - U

Peek-a-boo ties of the 1960's are recreated, each depicting and commenting on different stereotypical sexual preferences and eroticism

Mixed Media Installation ~ Rosy Dadouche ~ Death of A Salesman *H -Java-U A tribute to the tragedy of holding onto delusions when reality does not correspond with what is imagined because reality itself is part of the delusion. Mixed-media

Installation/Sculpture ~ Amélie Pomerleau ~ Du Pareil au Même *H It is a creation in response to Pierro della Francesca painting. A 5 X 16 ft. rectangular space established with two pine arches, one as high as 10 ft., is the setting for this sculptural installation rooted in sacred symbols.

Mixed media collage ~ Carrie Bradish & Melissa McGrath ~ Postcard Collective *VE

A series of one hundred postcard sized mixed media drawings make up the collaborative piece as a whole. The work emphasizes, as stated by the artists, communication while ironically inhabiting a method of conversion that is brief, frivolous and a superficial link to others.

Visual art (textile/photo)/ performance ~ Marguerite Bromley ~ Untitled *VL The performance aspect of this work will entail the artist machine-sewing photographs together over the course of a few days to create a photographic quilt. The photographs will be detailed colored images of texture fabrics and will be hung on a clothesline while not being used in performance.

Mixed media on canvas~ Matthew Morein ~ Untitled: The tripych, Dan Hates Me "Cause I Like Letters, Untitled (Freaky Family), VERsaké, Sortie #1, From CSI International to Bed Bath & Beyond *VA, *SC Working in collaboration with other artists such as David Gutierrez, Daniel Pelissier & Ruderik Padolski, Matthew presents visual dialogues between two artists working together on the same canvas.

To open up the minds of ten individuals to a different realm of thinking, so that they can apply this experience to future projects.

Installation/design ~ Ani Surmenian ~ Don't Mind the Wait *VL Ani Surmenian wants to create a place where waiting can be a pleasure. A corner is set up like a small waiting room, and a specially created chair is placed in the center. This chair has been modified for your pleasure, including blankets, cushions, hidden magazine compartments and adjustable tables.

Performance/instillation ~ Laura MacDonald ~ Nap *VA
Sleep and dreaming is for the most part a private experience however during
the duration of her piece MacDonald will take naps in the space, knowing that
she will be watched wile she sleeps. Surrounded with TV monitors, viewers
will also be invited to take the occasional nap, in the space.

Sound/instillation ~ Flint ~ TV Bass, electrified *VL

People passing through the space will be invited to interact with the music performed by turning knobs on a television which will distort the sound. This performance brings together music, sculpture and performance in an experimental musical multimedia work. Using salvaged materials not usually associated with instruments (TV), While also breaking barriers between audience and performer.

Video Installation ~ **Jean Francois Mean** ~ *Video Installation* ***LB** The city is a labyrinth; walking through it trailing a ball of yarn, ones trail of consciousness is made visible to all passersby.

Visual art (book) ~ Amy Wong ~ Untitled/unknown *VL Small books containing imagery only, there will be no titles, descriptions, explanations of concept or even medium--just colourful and eclectic assemblage of images. Using digital media techniques, Wong intends to maintain the tradition of the picturebook while creating an opportunity to enjoy a visual experience for the masses.

Visual art (book) ~ Pamela Cantor ~ A Self-Help Guide to Self-Discovery in a Mind of Confusion, Delirium, Angst and Joy. *VL

Using text that will read like a stream of consciousness, the book aims to reassure the viewer of various topics like irrational emotions and confusion. Cantor also uses painting and drawing techniques including mixed media such as pencil, ink,

chalk, oil pastel, acrylic paint and gel medium.

Visual art (book) ~ Sarah Mangle ~ A Rope Around the Stomach *VL It's a vaguely metaphorically autobiographic storybook, where illustrations speak for themselves. Coloured hand-drawn images intertwined with typewritten text, this book deals with self-discovery and play, reflecting Mangle's own childhood, as well as notions of recreating destiny. In addition blank books will be made available for the viewer to create their own story.

Visual art (book) ~ Sarah Partridge ~ In a Bind: "Great expectations", "Between texts", "Catch 22" *VL

In a Bind will include 4 handbound books that are metaphoric art objects in themselves. Dealing with the complex symbolism of books, their role as icons of learning and knowledge and our personal relationships with them.
