- 2) Write also some notes on where/who you distribute to, and your city. This is important because in the future we want to create a world map with all the copies in the different cities.
- 3) Print and bind (rilega) your copies!

Guidelines to print:

- Print all pages
- Set the copies to how many copies you decided to print
- A4 HORIZONTAL
- Front/back (fronte/retro)
- Black and white
- Scale: 100% -> even if there is a warning that parts of the page will be cut out!
- DON'T adapt with another %
- Margins: ZERO
- short side/edge binding (Rilegatura taglio corto) (Bindung an kurzer Kante) !!!!!!!!

guidelines to bind:

- be careful not to change the order of the pages!
- take the first 18 A4 sheets that came out of the printer
- align them carefully and fold (piegali) them exactly in the middle
- press a lot, should stay folded
- 4) IF YOU HAVE ANY PROBLEM OR DOUBTS, PLEASE TELL US AND WE WILL HELP YOU PERSONALLY!
- 5) FOR THE COVER: Write 1+1=3 on the cover, with whatever pen/pencil/brush/pastel... you want, the size you want, the color you want.

 This is important because it is the design of the front cover, and you can do it.
- 6) Distribute it! Leave it in public spaces/museums/schools/... or give it personally to friends. Possibly, offer also something to drink to your friends and explain them what we are doing!
- 7) if you need more copies, just print more but remember to change the data in the same shared excel table:
