Clémence de La Tour du Pin (b. 1986, Roanne) lives and works in New York. Recent solo exhibitions include Derosia, New York, and Towards, Toronto. Aléa is an exhibition program initiated by Pierre Allain and Antoine Dochniak in 2025 at Artagon Pantin, a former school repurposed into artist studios. Conceived in dialogue with the building's history and the atmospheric conditions that may affect it, the program explores a sensitive reflection on the affective and emotional relationships between the artworks and their environment. Over the course of the year, international artists are invited to develop site-responsive proposals across varied timeframes. Each project will unfold in different parts of the building: a rooftop terrace, a meeting room, a screening room, and the corridors.
