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




- 8. FISHER, Allen. FFACECE. London: Aloes Books, 1972. 1st edition. One of 50 numbered copies, signed by Fisher on the frontispiece, this copy designated by him as belonging to Paul Buck. 4to. Ring bound. [48pp. printed on rectos only]. Using a photograph supplied by Felipe Ehrenberg of the guerrilla Genaro Vázquez Rojas. Very Good with some inevitable slight wear. £150
 - 9. FISHER, Allen. FFACECE. London: Aloes Books, 1972. 1st edition. One of 50 numbered copies, signed by Fisher on the frontispiece, this copy designated by him as belonging to Jim Pennington. 4to. Ring bound. [48pp. printed on rectos only]. Very Good, the front cover with a nick to the tail edge, the lower corner a little spotted, and one of the rings missing a small piece (without much impact). Pennington is to this day the publisher of Aloes Books, co-founded with Fisher and Dick Miller.

Contributors include Ed Sanders, Claude Pélieu, Charles Plymell, Jeff Nuttall, Mark Hyatt, Opal L. Nations, Kris Hemensley, Doug Lang, Pete Hoida, Alvin Stinton, Dick Miller, Jim Pennington, Pearl White, Thomas Net, and Fisher. Very Good, the staples having taken two attempts, some sheets with staple ghosts at the fore edge (presumably misbound initially), and the back cover a little soiled.

A collection of six autograph and one typed letters signed to Chris Torrance between the mid-1970s to 2017, variously about or mentioning the Poetry Society (its problems), PLACE, small press publishing and distribution, Jackson Mac Low, Barry MacSweeney, Brian Catling, readings and teaching, Albion Village Press, and The Magic Door, with the last two (written on cards showing Fisher's paintings Lugg Mill and EMBRACE) concerning and containing a note by Fisher for its collected volume. Of the previous five, from the 1970s, a couple have Spanner stamps, and one is written across FIELDS 2, 3, 5, and 6 as well as another card by him, GOLD FLAKE. Very Good. f150



Described in French Schmuck as 'Clues to that morning-after-the-night-before feeling in a series of b/anal photos, lusciously printed in three curry colours'. Some moderate creasing, but Very Good overall. £30

Published as Prison Clothes Press 6, edited by Jeff Nuttall and Ulli McCarthy. Stain to the lower corner throughout (though not affecting the front cover or the text), otherwise about Very Good all things considered, the front cover with an unobtrusive band of discolouration at the head edge, the blank back cover with an area of soiling, but sound. For London Performance 'A', on 28 October 1974, which also involved Bill Griffiths, Lee Harwood, Eric Mottram, David Miller, Judy Walker, Paul Brown, Pearl White, and the audience. Very Good with inevitable wear from use, the front creased towards the spine.



It intends to act as a set of proposals for the undertakings summarised to act as a PROjects SYNopsis. The catalogue becomes, therefore, an artifact limited by itself and capable of its own increase as a SYNthetic Cell.' Very Good, with moderate wear. Good only, primarily due to toning, but appealingly this copy has been extensively annotated in pencil by Chris Torrance (although not bearing his name). £25

Extracts from 'The Art of Flight: I—XXVII: A Selection for Eric Mottram and Jackson Mac Low'; 'The Art of Flight' is Fisher's treatise on the terms 'light' and 'dark', where 'Flight' is fugue, folly, and fancy. One sheet present twice (not included in collation above); that aside, Very Good, with a mild band of discolouration towards the spine (not affecting the design). 32. FISHER, Allen. Convergences, in place, of the play. Volume eight. June 8 1973. [London]: Spanner, 1976. 1st edition. Folio. Loose sheets folded into 24pp. Fine, given the newspaper format, folded once horizontally (as issued). £20

33. FISHER, Allen. STANE, drafted 31.12.75, comprising most of place Book III, place forty-five to eighty-one, Second Movement. London: Aloes Books, 1977. 1st edition. One of 100 copies signed and numbered by the author with a specially prepared cover (of 500). Oblong 4to. Very Good with slight rubbing and creasing, the blank lower wrapper a little soiled. This copy has been designated by Fisher as belonging to David Miller; an autograph postcard signed from 1983 is loosely inserted.

This copy has been designated by Fisher as belonging to Anthony Barnett, 'with thanks for the permission to use a fragment of his work'; Barnett has made an adjustment to the fragment. £40

Good only, the wrappers well spotted, though better internally. This copy has been designated by Fisher as belonging to Chris (Torrance), who has made fairly extensive if occasional annotations in pencil. £20

Oblong 4to. Stitched wrappers. pp.[iv], [52], [iv]. A Fine copy of the regular edition (which, it seems, was less likely to contain the abovementioned slips). £25



38. FISHER, Allen and JORIS, Pierre. FIRE WORK. Hebden Bridge: HATCH Books, 1977. 1st edition. One of 34 copies numbered and signed by the authors (of 350). 8vo. Comprising 'FIRE-PLACE' by Fisher and 'HEARTH WORK' by Joris bound dos-à-dos, with a wraparound cover, each being [ii], 34pp. (with the order in which the two works are presented varying between copies). A couple of small corner chips to the wrappers in production, otherwise Fine.

39. FISHER, Allen and JORIS, Pierre. FIRE WORK. Hebden Bridge: HATCH Books, 1977. 1st edition. One of 316 copies (of 350). Very Good. This copy has been signed by Fisher and inscribed to Bill Griffiths, a tremendous association. £40

40. FISHER, Allen. Self-Portraits / Pink 149. London: Good Elf Publications, 1977. 1st edition. One of 200 copies. 4to. Single light blue sheet printed in black on both sides. Published as Lawrence Upton's FREESHEET/Second Series Number Two, distributed free by the press or the poet concerned. Peripheral fading and rubbing, but Very Good for the format.

41. FISHER, Allen. doing (against aesthetics as such. Hebden Bridge: [Pressed Curtains], 1977. 1st edition. Oblong 4to. Single sheet printed on both sides. Published as Twisted Wrist 1, edited by Paul Buck. Very Good, folded once vertically. £25


42. FISHER, Allen (ed.). SPANUAL. London: Aloes Books, [1977]. 1st edition thus. One of 50 copies. 4to. Ring bound, with an illustration affixed to the front cover. [364pp. often printed on rectos only]. Gathers the first ten issues of Spanner in the original sheets, spanning about two years, as follows: (1) The Pleasure of Chaos by John Cage and Eric Mottram; (2) Iron work by Martin Thom; (3) Fluxus FLUXshoe Fluxes; (4) Developable Surfaces: The Poetries of Christopher Middleton and John Riley by David Miller; (5) Wasichi by Ken Smith; (6) Frazier Ali and Licence to Dream: outline for A Comedy (& an opera including "Like James Dean (Cégèste's Aria" by Bill Sherman; (7) the CRUST issue; (8) Keeping Still by Phil Maillard (quest edited by Chris and Val Torrance); (9) Call it 'Something Else', a conversation between Dick Higgins and Eric Mottram; and (10) A Tale of Peter and other poems by John Welch. The supplements are not included, but adverts, sample covers, and 'waste material from Japanese Schmuck' are, and the cover, contents pages, and acknowledgements are new. There was also a second volume, for issues 11-20. The front cover illustration, which shows a spaniel with a spanner in its mouth, is a facsimile recently applied, albeit one supplied by the editor, and the binding is apparently a variant, this copy having come from the publisher. Mildly marked to the covers, their holes with ineffective splits at the binding, the front with a corner crease, and occasional light edgewear with a few tiny nicks, but Near Fine overall. £250

43. FISHER, Allen and MILLER, David. THE PREPARATION. London: The X Press, 1977. 1st edition. 4to. Stab-stapled. Unpaginated (58pp. printed on rectos only). Consisting of two texts, firstly 'The Preparation' by Miller, 'planned as something to be rewritten by one or two other writers, sticking fairly close to the details of the text, so that two or three "versions" of one text would exist which could be published together as a collaboration. The reasons: to get away from the notion of a definitive, perfect version of a writing, and to move away from a single view-point by inviting participation.' Fisher's subsequent 'Upon Unruled Wrapper' is 'a self-criticism as well as an interference, less apparent now than the first takes might have shown', with Miller's text. Very Good, very faintly toned at the head edge, and with mild staple rust, one staple not having penetrated fully (but secure). Errata slip present. £20

44. FISHER, Allen. An autograph letter signed ('Allen') to David (Miller), dated 5 August 1978, comprising four single—sided sheets (33.5 x 19cm) in which Fisher discusses the term anankē, the relationship between machinery (as tool) and natural law, death, and Guy Debord. Very Good, folded for mailing (the envelope not present), the first sheet with a nick/bump. Also present are an autograph card and note (both signed 'Allen') to Miller, the former evidently from 2000 or thereabouts, the latter undated but using the DISPOSSESSION & CURE leaflet (in the same format as in item 119).

45. FISHER, Allen. DOCKING. Bishop's Stortford: Great Works Editions, 1978. 1st edition. One of 200 copies. 4to. Stab—stapled. Unpaginated (48pp. printed on rectos only). Near Fine, the head edge slightly spotted, in about Very Good dust jacket, more spotted (peripherally for the most part) though generally crisp. £25

46. FISHER, Allen. LONDON BLIGHT. London: tapocketa press, 1978. 1st edition. Single sheet folded twice into 16mo. The sheets were usually cut horizontally to the centre, this example not cut; that aside, Very Good Plus. £18

Wrappers. pp.[ii], [x], [212], [vi] all printed on rectos only. Cover by Colin Izod. A little rubbed with a tiny nick, the lower spine fold gently bumped at the head edge, and the spine with a minor area of soiling, but Very Good Plus. With the loosely inserted errata slip as well as the ownership initials of John James.

48. FISHER, Allen. BECOMING: being most of place book IIII + much of book V, drafted january 1978. London: Aloes Books, 1978. 1st edition. 4to. Wrappers. pp.[ii], [x], [212], [vi] all printed on rectos only. With the errata slip. A copy for fun, described by Chris Torrance on the inside upper wrapper as 'redecorated with "Franchette" Argentinian Red wine by the eminent Anglo-Welsh critic Chris O'Neill 5.5.79 design improved by Chris Torrance 7.5.79'. One can imagine the condition, but Torrance has made the best of a bad lot, the effect is surprisingly striking, and the text itself is ok. The book has in fact been signed by Fisher ('Allen') and inscribed to Torrance, who has also made a small number of pencilled annotations and is the dedicatee of 'to ease an apparency' herein.
