NADAN is pleased to present the first solo exhibition of ceramic works by multidisciplinary artist Starczewski in Germany during Berlin Art Week 2024. Entitled "Moulding the Ideas" the exhibition showcases selected ceramic works from the artist's oeuvre, highlighting the versatility and depth of Starczewski's sculptural work and emphasizing the significance of his boundary-crossing endeavors.

The avant-garde character of Antoni Starczewski's works resounds with exceptional force today. They are the result of experiments created from the late 1950s to the beginning of the 1980s, when they were an element of public de ceramics in Poland interiors or the heritage of folk culture. These realisations were part of the language of expressing the ideas of linear notation, materialising a very consistently developed concept.

Antoni Starczewski (1924–2000) was one of the most significant Polish artists of the 20th

century. Educated at the Academy of Fine Arts in Łódź, he was greatly influenced by the teachings of avant-garde artist Władysław Strzemiński. A particular characteristic of his art was the multimedia and multi-layered use of a wide variety of surfaces, techniques and textures, including ceramics, prints, textiles and in-situ projects. Starczewski explored the fields of visual art, music and language and



combined them in an inimitable way. A fundamental principle of his work was his conscious refusal to differentiate between fine and applied arts. He sought the expression of his ideas in different materials and methods and regarded art as an area in which related statements can interplay in a variety of forms.

Another aspect of his work reflects both the political and social situation as well as the personal perspective of the respective time in Poland. Against this backdrop, his selected

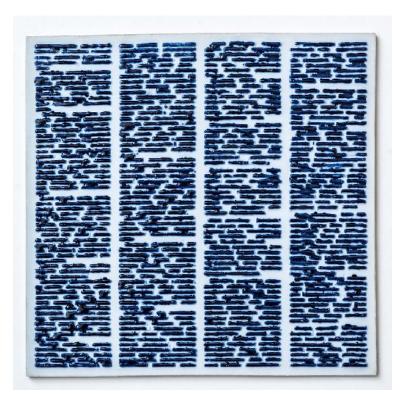

works are currently on display at the Neue Nationalgalerie in Berlin as part of the exhibition "Extreme Tension. Art between Politics and Society. Collection of the Nationalgalerie 1945–2000".

The works in the exhibition were created between the late 1950s and the beginning of the 1980s and are divided into three groups of works, which can be categorized as wall ceramics, ceramic



installations and prints. They are characterized by their high quality of craftsmanship, their richness of ideas and their original conception. His ceramic works, which are presented in the exhibition, are a testimony to his innovative formal language and his deep understanding of the material.

Antoni Starczewski's works are represented in the collections of major institutions and museums worldwide, including the Tate Modern in London, the Victoria & Albert Museum in London, the Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam, the Galleria Nazionale d'Arte Moderna in Rome and

the Muzeum Sztuki in Starczewski's hometown of Łódź. His works have also been presented at renowned biennials: the 8th International Biennial Exhibition of Prints in Tokyo in 1979 and numerous participant in the Biennale Internationale de la Tapisserie in Lausanne and at monumental presentation "Presence polonaise" in Centre Pompidou in Paris, 1983.

About the curators

Marta Kowalewska is an art historian and critic, curator of exhibitions and author of texts on art. She is the chief curator at the Central Museum of Textiles in Łódź (CMWŁ), where she curated the 16th and 17th International Triennials of Tapestry and led the curatorial team, which developed CMWŁ's anniversary exhibition Departments Open / Departments Closed. She has put together Polish and international exhibitions, including: The Work That Textile Does, Metamorphism. Magdalena Abakanowicz, Antoni Starczewski. The Idea of Linear Notation in Łódź, THREADS OF A NEW SPIRITUALITY - Kosmos Project (Milan), We Are Textile Culture Net! (Hong Kong). She published essays in books From Tapestry to Fiber Art: The Lausanne Biennials 1962–1995 (Lausanne-Milan), Magdalena Abakanowicz (Tate Modern, London), Magdalena Abakanowicz à Lausanne (Lausanne-Zurich), Abakanowicz. Konfrontacje (Warsaw), Tapta. Flexible Forms (Susch-Berlin). She also edited the books Magdalena Abakanowicz. Metamorphism; Textile Textures. Multithreaded narratives; Antoni Starczewski. The Idea of Linear Notation; Splendour of Textiles and Weave Ideas.

She has published more than seventy articles, critical texts and interviews. She has been on the juries of international textile art competitions and is a board member of the European Textile Network, as well as the chairwoman of the Marta Magdalena Abakanowicz- Kosmowska and Jan Kosmowski



Foundation Advisory Board. For the past four years she has been co-managing the project Textile Culture Net.

Grzegorz Musiał — Art historian and critic. He studied art history at the Jagiellonian University, the Courtauld Institute of Art at the University of London and Leiden University. After graduating, he worked as a curator at the Muzeum Sztuki in Łódź, the first museum of modern art in Europe (founded in 1931). From 1992 to 2007, he ran his own gallery for modern art in Łódź, Gallery 86. Since 2007, he has been the artistic director of the Signum Foundation in Poznan and Venice.

He has curated numerous exhibitions, including: Tina Modotti, Museum of Art in Łódź, 1980; Koji Kamoji – Hole, Moon, Silence, Gallery 86, 2001; Tadeusz Kantor La clase muerta, M U A in Alicante, 2002, To go across the border of the painting, Gallery 86 and Awake and Dream; Luce e movimento and Particolare at the Palazzo Dona in Venice; Antoni Starczewski, The idea of Linear Notation, Central Museum of Textiles, Łódź; The Urge to Create Visions, Sculpture Museum in Orońsko, Poland; Where does your heart belong. Museum of Modern Art in Bremen, Germany. Publication of numerous books on the exhibitions.

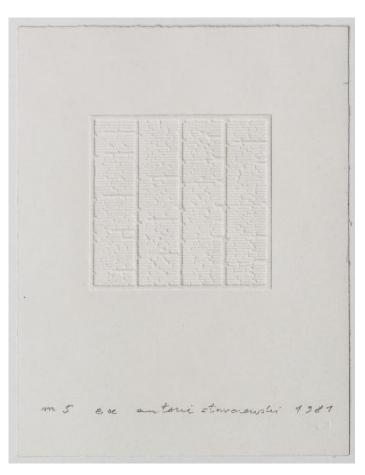
