5 Featured Exhibitions at Frieze London

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Contemporary art gallery Frieze London, held annually in London's Regent's Park, is celebrating its 20th anniversary this year. Over 160 galleries will be in London between 11-15 October, Frieze London, one of the most anticipated events of the global calendar. As well as the Frieze Sculpture program and Artist Prize, the art fair also features a range of new collaborations with the UK's leading arts organisations. Take a look at the 5 featured exhibitions below.

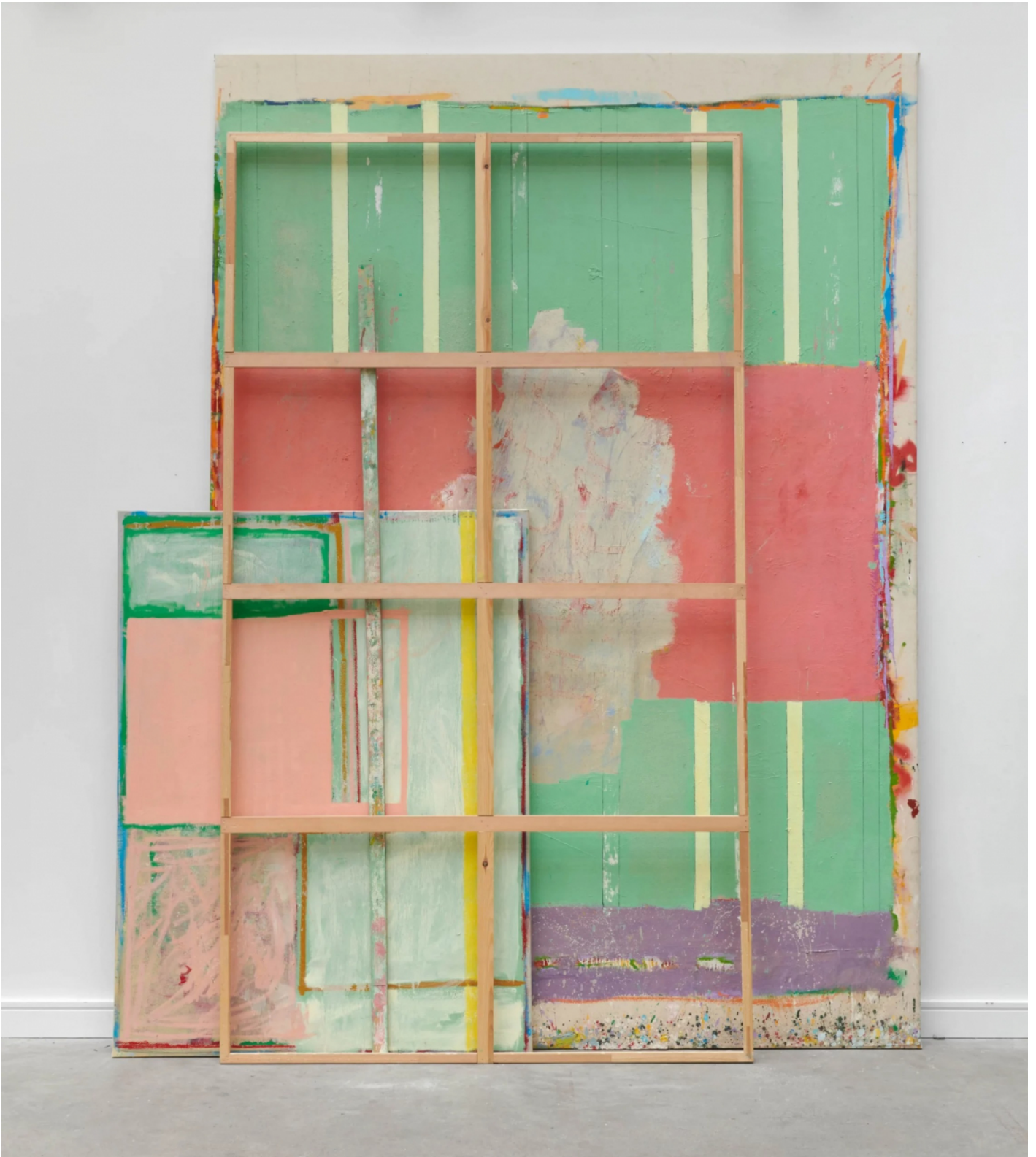
Sue Dunkley - *Mayor Gallery*

This exhibition references overlooked figures of British Pop Art. In her works, Su Dunkley reflects subjects such as the female body and the masculine gaze of the 60s and 70s on her canvas with vibrant colors. He especially paints icons such as John F. Kennedy, Robert Kennedy, Gilbert & George and Marilyn Monroe, who he thinks had dramatic lives. A series of pastel drawings highlight Dunkley's sensitivity to body language and his ability to arrange figures in mysteriously tense scenes.



Marina Rheingantz - *Maré*

In the exhibition where Brazilian artist Marina Rheingantz presents a series of landscape paintings, her touches reminiscent of 19th century brush strokes, textile stitches and pixels attract attention. His landscape paintings, which include abstract symbols and figures, reference rural Brazil.



Jhonatan Pulido - *One Breath and Two Blinks*

Although Jhonatan Pulido's paintings seem abstract at first glance, they actually reflect the elements of the urban texture of his native Colombia. Pulido, who grew up during the civil conflicts of the 1990s, abstractly synthesizes political, public and social issues in his works. Although his works are two-dimensional, they have a sense of depth.



Anthony Cudahy - *Double Spar*

Painter Anthony Cudahy, who works at the Hales and GRIMM galleries in London, exhibits his mirroring method and various effects at *Double Spar*. The exhibition features large-scale figurative paintings featuring intimate and dreamlike scenes of daily life. Cudahy also includes elements from other artists from the past and present in his exhibition.



James Lee Byars and Seung-taek Lee - *Invisible Questions That Fill the Air*

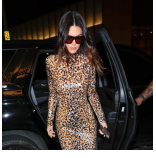
This exhibition brings together sculptures created by James Lee Byars and Seung-taek Lee. Although American Byars and Korean Lee have different origins, they share a similar sensitivity regarding the materials, themes and forms they use in their works. Lee creates sculptures with natural objects such as stones and tree branches, while Byars similarly uses natural materials such as sea sponges. With these works, they touch on the temporary, fragile, cosmic and invisible theme of nature.
