CLAUDIA:one of my colleagues I work with they **COLLECT** A **SINGLE SHEET OF TOILET PAPER** from every person's house they visit and they've got this log and I just can't wait for her to come to my house and take some of my toilet paper.

JAKUB: WOAH!

CLAUDIA: I love it. Like there's so much story in that and it's really an object that you wouldn't think of saving.

JAZZ: I guess that's a really interesting way for you, for yourself, documenting your experience. Do you collect or find ways to document?

CLAUDIA: I collect **DO-NOT-DISTURB SIGNS** from every stay in a hotel.

LINZY: How many have you got?

CLAUDIA: I don't know. I've not counted and I really need to do something with them.

I've got like lots of part collections, postcards and gig memorabilia. I found one the other day.... my parents were just moving, so they've given me a box of things that I must sort out, it's ridiculous really, the things I've kept....There's a picture of Tony Blair with one of those laughing gas canisters saying 'Make Gas, Not War' from a nightclub sometime. I just really need to get rid of it, but I can't. IT'S STORIES OF TIME, THROUGH A RANDOM OBJECT.

Recently I got really obsessed with Skittles, so I joined the Skittles team at Knowle Cricket Club, there's so many stories within that and things people would say. Like, if you get over 30, I think you get a clap and they'll say, 'nice 32!' and if the pair gets over a certain number, then they'll say 'WFLL DONE' THE PAIR!'.

I was in the Winter League and it's called Knowle Crazy Cabs because the team used to be all taxi drivers and the winner, like THE PERSON WHO GETS THE HIGHEST SCORE, gets the tote, which is a pound back.

And it's like intergenerational, I guess as well, like with the sticker upper and then you've got the secretary and everyone's got like a different role in it.

LINZY: Have you designed any games, Jakub?

JAKUB: Any games? I actually don't think so.. it wasn't really a game but I did my own version of the oblique strategies by Brian Eno, which is like these cards that give you **PROMPTS FOR MAKING THINGS.** So I made my own version of that. I think that's the closest to a game that I've kind of done, or just setting myself crazy restrictions.. I overthink things when I'm making things a lot... so I guess I'll make a game out of something....

For example, I was doing this book, I had no idea what to do for it. So gave myself the limitation of only being able to use photos from certain books in a certain library, and then I had to whiz around. I gave myself an hour and a half to scan all these photos in and use that. So yeah, kind of making restrictions as to make things a bit, I know, easier for myself and gamifying the process of making....
