How do people create and engage

with spatial representations in their mind?

Critique of Pure Reason

Kant's first two arguments (at A23-4) run as follows:



1.) Space is not an empirical concept that has been drawn from outer experiences. For in order for certain sensations to be related to something outside me, the **representation of space must already be their ground**. Thus the representation of space cannot be obtained from the relations of outer appearance through experience, but this outer experience is itself first possible only through this representation.
